Chef's Note: Châteaubriand is a small roast extravagantly cut from the center of the beef tenderloin. In the 200 years since it was first prepared by the Vicomte de Châteaubriand's chef, Montmireil, we seem to have lost it's exact dimensions. Some people will tell you that it can be as little as 1-1/2 inches thick. Confit (CON-FEET) of goose (confit d'oie) and duck or chicken are usually prepared from the legs of the bird. The meat is salted and seasoned with herbs, and slowly cooked submerged in its own rendered fat, in which it is then preserved by allowing it to cool and storing it in the fat.

As we enter the 2010-2011 Elk year, the slow economy doesn't only affect us at home, it affects our lodge. We are faced with many large expenditures needed to upkeep the building, and pay our bills. If you don't realize how difficult it has been in the last few years to generate much needed income to pay our expenses and try to reinvest in our lodge, you really should talk to one of our Trustee's.

Mid last year, many of us concerned Elks/LOE were discussing ideas and my thought was that we have to use what assets we have. It seemed that

other efforts like working a booth at the sports forum proved to be difficult to keep a consistent crew since it was hard work and inconvenient. As I saw it, our biggest asset is we have a Banquet Hall that sits empty most Saturdays and many other days of the week, in a convenient part of Tampa, with not much competition in the area who could offer affordable hall rentals. In addition, it would seem to be a lot easier to get volunteers to help with these events since they were at their lodge. Lastly, it is a great way to bring in new members when they see what a great organization we have. We have had many folks attending an event who ask us what does it take to become an

This year I have volunteered to head up the Hall Rental committee, to generate this much needed income. I started generating interest last year through different types of advertisements, and we are starting to get a consistent flow of interest and the hall is being booked on many Saturday nights in the upcoming months. From the profit of these events, we have been able to invest in white linen tablecloths/napkins, white linen chair covers, curtains to soften the walls, elegant

centerpieces, and we are able to get chair sashes/table runners in satin or organza in all the popular wedding colors at a deep discount. All of these items are rented for the event, adding to the profit


