

Learning about your Lodge!
House Committee Chairman

From the Editor:

This is the first in a series of articles highlighting the roles of individuals and the responsibilities of the multitude of com-

mittees that are part of Tampa Lodge 708. We chose the House Committee Chairman, Rob Harlow, as our first interview because the House Committee affects many aspects of our Lodge. Whether you are having a meal from the kitchen, a drink at the bar, or a friendly gathering at the Lodge, you are being touched by the House Committee, its members, and its' chairman.

As "House Committee Chairman" Rob Harlow brings his experience and people skills to play every day in keeping the Lodge running. I posed a few questions to Rob in order to get a better feel for his Lodge history and his responsibilities over and above the House Committee position. Rob has been a member of Tampa Lodge 708 for 4 years, a relative newbie given our long history. During that time Rob has served as a member of many committees and worked on functions spanning a variety of interests. He has



served as officer in our Lodge for three terms in the positions of "Esquire", "Esteemed Lecturing Knight", and currently is serving as "Esteemed Loyal Knight". In this latest capacity his primary function is "Defender" in the "Subordinate Forum" (this will be a topic for another article). He is present during many of the Lodge functions and can be seen lending a hand, his ideas, and a warm heart whenever it's needed. Last year Rob was the ENF Chairman. In that capacity, Rob helped the lodge raise a sizable amount through various fundraisers including the "St Valentines Massacre Party" for the State and National Elk Foundations.

I had time to ask Rob a few questions about his House Committee Chair roles and responsibilities. Beside the requirement of multiple meetings, he is ultimately responsible for the financial health of the Lodge. **Here is how he summarized the House Committee:**

"I chair the Committee that manages the lounge and restaurant in the lodge, we insure that the facilities are operating within the standards and guidelines set forth by the Grand Lodge, and work to insure compliance with Federal, State and Local business practice regulations. The Committee sets prices of goods sold and oversees all employee relations. The Committee is also responsible for enforcing the House Rules in accordance with article IX section 2 of the By-Laws-House Rules and Rules of the order of Tampa Lodge #708" (ask Secretary Carl Williamson if you would like a copy of these rules).

Who else serves on the House Committee?

"The House Committee is typically 12 members; currently, there is one open position. Our current members are:

Vernon Pickenpaugh William Kinney Addison Horrell Brian Brantley Bonnie Quire Bob Green

Lisa Snyder William Edwards Chris Miles Wendy Wiesler Jerry Reid" "vacant"

Rob went on to say that "committee members, like all committees, are appointed by the Exalted Ruler and serve a term of one year. This can be extended with the direction of a newly elected Exalted Ruler". None of the members, including Rob, are paid for their affiliation with the House Committee. At a minimum, all committee members attend bi-monthly meetings discussing the inner workings of our Lodge, not forsaking their other Lodge interests and commitments. You can count on Rob spending 10 to 12 hours a week working some aspect of House Committee work.

When asked about the biggest need facing the House Committee this year, Robs' reply was: "We desperately need kitchen volunteers! We have a core group that just manages to keep the kitchen open, however, we really need just a hand-full of volunteers willing to commit to working one night per month. With some renewed energy and ideas in the kitchen, I believe we can make our little kitchen more successful".

What one thing would you like to tell our membership about the House Committee?

"We have a lot of new faces in House Committee this year, and a lot of new ideas and energy to go along. I am confident this lodge will have a good year with all the hard work I see being done every day".

I hope you found what the "House Committee" does informative - I sure did! It is not an easy job coordinating the efforts of 12 people and then having to report to the Lodge Officers on each aspect. We hope we sparked an interest. Next time you visit Tampa Lodge 708, eat a meal, or attend a special function, or note the improvements, talk with any House Committee members and share your views regarding what you would like to see. More Important, find some time to get involved in the inner workings of the House Committee, because your involvement works to keep Tampa Lodge 708 such a warm and welcoming place.
