Leap Year!

What does that mean to you? Right off the bat, it tells you there are twenty-nine days in February. It also means that February will have a rare shot at having five Wednesdays in the month. Without a leap year February could not hope to have more than four of any individual days within the month. We will have to wait for four years before we see that again. But what about the poor folks who are born on February 29th? They only have a birthday every four years! Is that fair? I guess it is as fair as anything else in life.

The leap year is society's mathematical method of making sure our calendar doesn't throw our seasons out of synch. It actually takes 365.2422 days to get from one vernal equinox, (the time it takes for the sun to circle the earth and reach a position directly above the Equator), to the next. If we didn't throw a day in here or there, our seasons would be about 24-days ahead of themselves after just 100 years! So why not do something special on our extra day this year. We are all very proud that we have met our per-capita goals on our major projects, so why not make an extra contribution to our own Harry Anna Trust Fund? It could be the start of a great tradition every four years.

February is also a very patriotic month, specifically in the celebrations of President Abraham

Lincoln's Birthday on February 12th (1809) and President George Washington's Birthday on February 22nd (1732 or February 11th, 1731 depending on which calendar – Julian or Gregorian—you used). While the federal government never formally honored Lincoln's birthday, seven states formally honored the births of the 16th President. However, while the day was recognized informally across the nation, President Washington's birthday was formally commemorated by a bill signed into law on January 31st, 1879 by President Rutherford B. Hayes. However, in 1968 the Uniform Monday Holiday Law placed the formal commemoration of Washington's birthday to the third Monday of February which we now refer to as President's Day. However, Congress, President Nixon, who signed the Bill on June 28th, 1968, and the enacted legislation never made reference to President's Day.

Naturally, I would be remiss if we didn't mention Saint Valentine's Day. In case you have forgotten, this is a day to express love and affection between intimate companions. While a Tuesday is not actually a romantic day, I know our Elks will do their best on this romantic day. 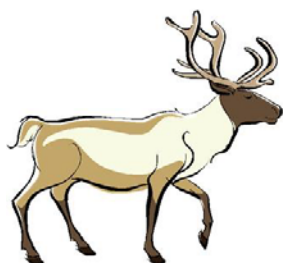
ELKS MEMBERSHIP REPORT
