Now that we have identified ourselves as a lodge that supports ENF and the community let's all try again to see what kind of an impact we can make for our Lodge.



Tampa Impact Grant: Club Chivalry for Success

Both the kids and the chaperones were excited by the nice luxury bus, which included outlets for charging our electronics. We had juice and pastries during the 2 hour drive, dropped off our dinner orders at a Subway restaurant in route, and arrived at camp right on time. The 5 instructors on the ropes course were excellent with the students! They started with doing some team building while still on or near the ground. Next the Youth Camp provided a traditional kid friendly hotdog lunch at no expense to the grant! (Thanks Florida Elks!) After lunch it was time to put on the climbing gear and hit the ropes. There are 10 different elements, from climbing up to first level to the zip line completion. Each section is progressive and teaches different skills. I was again very impressed with the camp staff, and their quiet encouragement, that enabled almost every child to succeed, and the couple of kids that didn't quite make it up into the air were still enlisted as helpers on the ground, participating and enjoying the day. On the way home we made a pit stop to pick up our pre-ordered sandwiches, ate on the bus, and arrived back at the school at exactly 7:00PM. # **OPEN ARMS MINISTRYFEEDS MORE THAN THEIRTUMMY'S...IT FEEDS YOUR SOUL!**


This worthwhile Elks Lodge outreach program is made possible by the wonderful volunteers who donate at least one Sunday morning a month, and by the hard work of Rita Smith who wrote the Beacon grant that supports it.

We've been working with Open Arms Ministry for the past 4 years and have received the Beacon Grant all four of those years with matching funds for 3 years totaling \$13,000. This money has been used to purchase socks and underwear, as well as Thanksgiving and Christmas Dinner. Over the summer, when one of the food sources for the weekly feeding is unavailable, we stock the freezer and pantry ensuring our homeless population (including many veterans) will have a great meal each Sunday morning.

This sounds great you say? How can I get involved you ask? Well it's not only food and clothing, we also prepare and serve the food and distribute clothing. All you need do is to show up to Hyde Park Methodist Church on Platt St. at 7:30 any Sunday morning ready to serve. Your ER Courtney runs the kitchen most 3rd Sundays of the month.

And yes we accept donations; shoes, Tupperware, hygiene items, blankets, jeans, backpacks, dry/can goods.
