

The big announcement! Tampa Elks have been approved for a second \$10.000 impact grant to continue our project — Club Chivalry for Successful Students - at Robinson High School. The grant year is January through December, so we are just finishing up the first year's grant. It has been a successful year overall, though the mentoring program is not where we would like for it to be yet. If you would like to be a mentor for a high school student, please go to the Hillsborough County Public Schools website and hit the green APPLY button to fill out an application. It takes a few weeks to get approved.

In November, we had a regular club day meeting on the 14th and then we had our first ever On Campus Field Trip on the 17th. This field trip started with a breakfast meeting in the cafeteria, then the students

had a 'Passport" to take with them to the job fair and have them initialed by the professionals at the job fair. There were more than 40 job fair participants in the gymnasium, so the students had plenty to learn about and they were quite busy for a couple of hours. Next, we enjoyed lunch "al fresco" in the bleachers at the baseball field. It was a beautiful day to be outdoors, and Ms. Chowning took advantage of that fact to lead them in an after-lunch kickball game. It was a good opportunity for the students in

the club to get to know each other better, and to finish off the extra drinks and snacks the Tampa Elks had provided. The students comfort level was noticeably improved, as was their cooperation, when we tried for a group photo session. The day ended in the auditorium with a talk by FBI agents that was attended by as many of the high school classes as the auditorium could hold.

BEACON GRANT NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT!

The Beacon Grant is our ongoing project with the Open Arms ministry at Hyde Park United Methodist Church. We use the \$2000.00 grant to provide Thanksgiving and Christmas meals to the homeless on the Sunday morning closest to the holiday, and to buy enough socks and underwear and used pants to get them through the winter months. About 30 Elks were on hand to serve turkey, dressing, mashed potatoes, yams, Green bean casserole, corn and salad to 174 homeless on November 20th. This year, Christmas falls on a Sunday, so the Elks need to find enough volunteers to serve on Christmas morning. What a great way to start the day! We also get a matching grant from Florida Elks Charities that we use to help the homeless through the summer months. Here is how you can help!

- 1. Clothing drive winter wear in all sizes is needed. Shoes, belts, and purses can also easily find a new home. You can put them in the antler room, but alert me or Courtney so they don't linger there...
- 2. Meal Prep we will be going in on Thursday, December22 at about 11:00 to prepare some of the side dishes and store them in the walk in refrigerator for heating on Sunday. This is a great opportunity for those that can't bear to see the sunrise but would like to get involved. We usually spend about 3 hours in the kitchen at Open Arms.
- 3. Serve On Christmas morning, December 25th, Courtney will be managing the kitchen at Open Arms, and we are suppose to have enough Elks to fill the serving line at 7:30 AM. There is plenty of parking in two big lots at Magnolia and Azeele. Go in the door marked kitchen entrance –Courtney will be right inside to direct you from there. Please let me know you are coming and I will have a name tag waiting for you. You will be finished by about 9:30.

GRATITUDE GRANT NEEDS HELP TOO!

The Gratitude Grant is the one we earned by meeting our per capita for ENF. The first part of our project took place Nov. 15th, when we had a professional mime and motivational speaker come to BridgePrep Academy and talk to the kids about bullying. He gave two shows – one for about 200 elementary kids, and a second for about 100 middle schoolers. They LOVED him! They thought he- and by extension the Elks – were super cool.

The second part of the grant will take place at 6PM on Monday, December 12th when we will be catering *a Modern and Multicultural Holiday Feast*. Students and their parents will be invited, so there may be a really big crowd.

What can you do?

Ethnic dishes will be the focal point, so if you have a great and inexpensive recipe, please let me know. If we include it, please come help us prepare it. Food prep will probably be a multi day event starting Saturday. There will be a lot of schlepping involved on the evening of the event.

- Can you pick up a prepaid order at an area restaurant and deliver it to the school? Can you haul a load of paper supplies from the lodge to the school?
- Can you put on some Elks logo clothing and help serve the meal?
- Can you be at the lodge upon our return to help clean up and put things away?


