We began by offering the local improv group "Improve-aholics" a place to rehearse and try out their routines once a week. (1 new member.) We entered into a partnership with the South Tampa Chamber of Commerce Military group who have their meetings in our Lodge once a month. (1 new member.) We have a South Tampa networking group meeting here once a week. (2 new members.) We have begun a partnership with MGM Charity Partners who have planned 2 happy hours, the first was held on June 15th, and a 70's Party to raise funds for children and veterans. (1 new member.) In addition we opened our back hall to Pot Luck and Paints to raise money for The Centre for Girls, and Robinson HS and Plant HS held year end celebrations in our facility. By doing this, not only did we help our community businesses and institutions, but we hosted over 250 people that otherwise may never have known about us. Let's keep this momentum going! I'd love to hear your ideas on how to extend our contact.

District Vice President's Annual Report

This is a short synopsis of our District VPs Annual Report. Should you wish to view her full report please contact Georgia Hilficker at georgia@hilficker.com and she will email you the entire missive.

The WCD was #1 in membership among the Florida Districts this year with the net again of 235 members. All eight lodges had a plus gain, the only district which had all lodges showing a gain. In addition to the FSEA incentive program, the WCD under the direction of PSP Palladini, District Sponsor, ran its own membership incentive resulting in an additional \$23,363 net gain in dues, fees and awards to our WCD lodges.

All WCD lodges met their ENF per capita making them eligible to apply for ENF Grants, which they did. Tampa Lodge received 6 grants including the IMPACT Grant and the FSEA Matching Beacon Grant. The WCD donated \$115,528 to ENF, the most donated by any Florida District. ENF Certificate Chairman, Richard Florence PER won a \$100 ENF certificate for his efforts. Furthermore, 708 ranked 2nd in the State and 2nd in Division 1 for Harry Anna contributions with a per capita of \$30.88 and 1 of our teens received the HOPE Scholarships while another received the Legacy Award. A very impressive year indeed!

The bar was set high by previous WCD VP Toni Goodrich, and we met the challenge. I am so proud of all the WCD Elks who put forth so much time and effort in making this an award winning year.



A few months ago Mike Speach, a 92 year old WWII veteran, moved to Tampa and realized he would need help getting around in his new home city. Since he was a Life Member of his Elk Lodge in California, he contacted our Lodge in the hope of finding someone that might help. He reached Rick Schneider, our secretary, who gave his name and number to Brian Brantley, VAVS chairman. Brian picked up the ball and offered to drive Mike to his doctor appointments, and grocery shopping trips. Soon Rick and Brian began to share the responsibilities and 3 weeks ago George Hilficker joined the group.

Mr. Speach was born in Syracuse, NY on February 28, 1924. He married his beloved wife Doris of 66 years and 4 day, shortly after returning from WWII in 1946. He was a math whiz in high school and upon entering the Navy he was sent to Radar school in Virginia Beach. At that time Radar was a fledgling science and the Navy was in great need of competent, qualified men. At the age of 19, having completed his training, Mike was positioned as Head Radar man in charge of a 12 man Radar Crew on the Fletcher class destroyer, USS Luce II. He served on the Luce II from its launch to its last day and has many heartwarming stories to share.

The USS Luce fought 5 battles in the Pacific, performed in both invasions of the Philippines, Leyte Gulf and Luzon, and was part of an escort armada taking Winston Churchill to meet with President Roosevelt for war plan discussions. She was a critical part of a mission to free our imprisoned servicemen in camps on the islands around the Philippines. In May of 1945 two Japanese suicide bombers attacked the Luce. She shot one down, but the explosion from the bomb it carried caused a power failure. Unable to bring her guns to bear in time, she was struck in the after section by the second kamikaze and ultimately sunk taking 126 of her 316 man crew with her. To date Michael Speach is the only member of the USS Luse crew still living.

Mike will join us July 2nd at the Patriotic Picnic and looks forward to meeting our members. He wants us all to know how much he appreciates our support and that he keeps us in his prayers.
