I'm sure you all join me in extending a warm thank you to Shelagh and everyone that contributed their time and talents in making this such a successful and enjoyable afternoon.

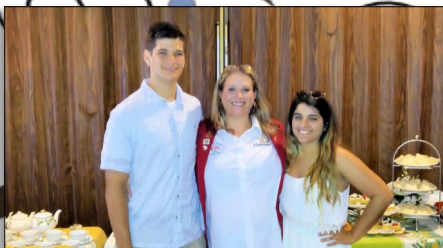

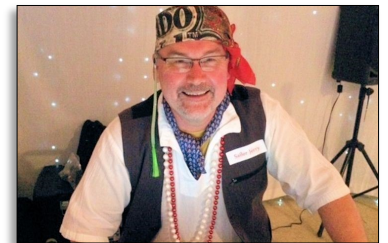


A 2016 CONVENTION FUNDRAISER

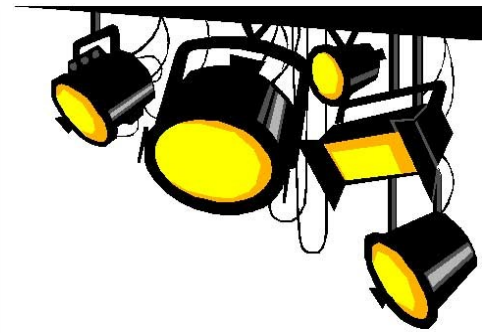


SOUTH TAMPA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE MILITARY AFFAIRS MEETING

AN IMPROV-A-HOLIC NIGHT AT THE LODGE



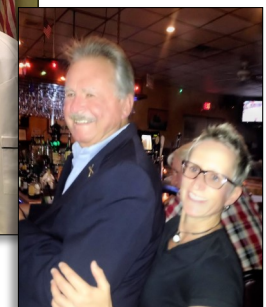

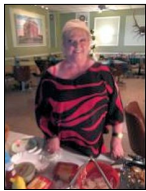

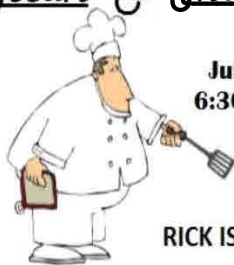
