Members, as we start to consider our charitable contributions for the upcoming year, let me share with you some facts regarding your ENF donations: 95% of the monies you donate goes directly toward the issues that you care most about; Robinson High School Club Chivalry, The Open Arms Homeless Ministry, The VA Domiciliary, and The Centre for Girls, are just a few of the



organizations that are making our community stronger through ENF Grants. That means that only 7.3% goes to administrative services and when you compare that to most charities that spend as much a 35% on administration that is great value for your donated \$. West Central District Finishes 1st in Net Membership Gain for 2016

Final 2016 results are in. The WCD finished first in net membership gain, and we were the only district in the state to have all lodges finish with a net membership gain. The WCD will receive \$4,000 under the State Membership Incentive Program, and New Port Richey will receive two \$1,500 awards for finishing third in both the number of new members and the percentage gain in membership. As a result of the WCD Cruise Award program, the total gain from dues, fees and awards net of the cost of the cruises and postage is \$23,663 for all eight lodges combined. Thank you to all that helped in making this a highly successful and lucrative program.

At \$21.81, the WCD placed second within the State in ENF per capita donations, and Tampa Lodge at \$53.75 placed second in the state and fifteenth in the nation. As a result of everyone's good work, Florida's \$12.21 ranked fifth in the national per capita ranking, a significant jump versus prior years. F.J. Palladini, PSP, WCD Sponsor

Happy Spring Everyone!



Our canopy and banner looked great and was definitely noticed by the approximately 1000 participants on the field that night. Right now we are at \$623.25 in funds raised, and our goal is \$1000.00. 




