ELKS NATIONAL CONVENTION REPORT

All Roads Lead to Reno for the 2017 Grand Lodge Convention, and it was an honor to be representing our lodge for this amazing gathering of members all there to share the success of our Order. And so it began: first the impressive Opening Ceremonies presided over by Millard C Pickering, Past Grand Exalted Ruler, and the presentation of each of our great nation's state flags. What patriotic pride was displayed in this ceremony! It portrayed to all present the destiny of our order, linked with the destiny of our country, especially now as we approach our 150 year anniversary of the Elks.

Much business had to be addressed during the sessions, starting with the reports of Committees:

- -The ENF Top Scholarship recipients presented inspiring speeches and we can all be proud of this group of young people. In all the Elks National Foundation gave out \$2,440.000 in scholarships to deserving young people this year. We can all be proud that we are investing in the future of our country's youth.
- -ENF Grants (Community Investment Program). This lodge year grants totaling \$33.1 million will be donated to our local communities to include Beacon, Freedom, Promise, Impact, and Gratitude Grants and a new \$1500 Anniversary grant in honor of our organizations 150 th anniversary will be awarded. What organization in our local areas would benefit from this money? Who in this nation contributes to strengthening our communities like ENF!
- -Elks Veterans Services reporting on Ending Homelessness for your Nations Veterans with the new "Welcome Home Program". I am proud to say that this program is already in action here at Tampa Lodge #708 helping our vets transition into permanent housing.
- -Our Drug Awareness Program (DAP) continues to help fight the epidemic of heroin addiction and the increasing dependency of opioids. Each year more than 59,000 die of overdoses and the number continues to grow. Continued on page 3


ELK OF THE MONTH: SUSIE HARLOW, PLP

Elks Youth Camp in Umatilla, Florida 2017:






HOMELESS VETERAN'S STAND DOWN EVENT








Welcome Home, Carolyn!


