
BOSTON BOB TURNED 80 "IN STYLE"

The Gratitude Grant Recipient this year was Bridgeprep Academy at St John's. This is a Hillsborough County Public Charter School of 286 students in Kindergarten through 8th grade. Our Chaplain, Christine Harris, is the Principal at this school and Tampa Elk Jennifer Gelsinger and her husband Michael work there also. They reported having a lot of trouble with inner racial or heritage fighting, and with bullying.

To address this problem, we first hired a professional speaker on the subject, Gary Tivanovich. He gave two separate one hour long assemblies – one for the elementary grades and a different one for the middle school aged kids. They loved him, and hung onto almost every word. The second part was to hold a Modern and Multicultural Holiday Feast for the students and their families on Dec



12th. Elks Christine Harris and Jennifer Gelsinger represented the school. Marty Quire put together a multicultural holiday slide show for our enjoyment, Becky and Bryan Sullins used Spotify to create background music. Georgia Hilficker offered advice and prepared our icebreaker.

We did the shopping and most of the cooking ourselves — only outsourcing 3 items, and the desserts were bought prepared. Sue Moore made her famous collard greens and Patty Jankiewicz agreed to bake the corn muffins. Lynn Brown treated us to another round of her turkey, dressing, gravy and her homemade cranberry sauce, and worked tirelessly for 2 days. We had a lot of assistants on Monday. 


