All ultrasound and heart rhythm screenings:

- Wear a short sleeved shirt that is open at the collar – no turtlenecks
- Wear a comfortable two-piece outfit consisting of loose clothing
- Do not wear pantyhose

Additional preparations:

Abdominal aortic aneurysm

- Fast for 4 hours prior to your screening.
- Make sure the meal you eat 4 hours prior to your screening is a light one (less than 1/2 of what you normally eat of non-gassy food).
- If you are thirsty during your fasting period, you may have 1/2 cup of coffee or tea and a moderate amount of water.
- If you take medication, take it as prescribed.
- If you are diabetic and are not comfortable fasting for 4 hours, limit yourself to a "diabetic meal" (piece of toast, 1 cup of any juice and 1/2 cup coffee or tea). If you are in doubt, please follow your diabetic care plan.

Complete lipid panel (cholesterol)

- Fast for 8 hours prior to your screening.

Atrial fibrillation (stroke)

- Do not wear pantyhose.
- Do not wear a watch.
- Keep your cell phone turned off.
- Do not wear lotion or oil.

Glucose (type 2 diabetes)

- Fast for 8 hours prior to your screening.

SPECIAL REPORT: 5 YEAR BY LAWS REVIEW & UPDATE, pg1

By Lodge Statutes, each subordinate Lodge is required to review and update their Bylaws every five years. These proposed changes will be voted on at the November 8th meeting. The Bylaw Committee members are Robert Bordonaro, Becky Sullins, Chaplain, Courtney Weil, PER, and Rita Smith, Treasurer.

These first two changes are required to be acted upon simultaneously.

Current Language:

OF THE TREASURER

Section 5. Whenever the amount of unappropriated cash in his possession shall exceed \$10,000.00, he shall notify the Chairman of the Board.

OF THE TRUSTEES OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 6. Whenever it may become aware, by notice or otherwise, that the amount of unappropriated cash in the hands of the Treasurer exceeds \$10,000.00, the Board may demand and receive from said Treasurer all unappropriated moneys in excess of said amount, giving its receipt therefor; and it shall deposit the same in one of the banks selected for deposit purposes by vote of the Lodge, or it may invest the same in such manner as the Lodge may have otherwise directed.

Proposed Change:

Section 5. Whenever the amount of unappropriated cash in his possession shall exceed \$15,000.00, he shall notify the Chairman of the Board.

OF THE TRUSTEES OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 6. Whenever it may become aware, by notice or otherwise, that the amount of unappropriated cash in the hands of the Treasurer exceeds \$15,000.00, the Board may demand and receive from said Treasurer all unappropriated moneys in excess of said amount, giving its receipt therefor; and it shall deposit the same in one of the banks selected for deposit purposes by vote of the Lodge, or it may invest the same in such manner as the Lodge may have otherwise directed...

Committee Logic:

This language had not changed in at least 15 years, but the amount we pay out monthly has increased substantially. Most months the bills against the Lodge exceeded 15,000.00, so the amount of 10,000.00 is no longer enough cash to carry us a month.

Current Language: ARTICLE IX: CLUB OPERATIONS AND MANAGEMENT

Section 1. The operation, management and control of the Home, Club or other facility owned and/or occupied by this Lodge shall be supervised and conducted by: A House Committee consisting of seven Members to be appointed by the Exalted Ruler.

The supervising or managing body of the Home, Club or other facility provided for herein, shall be subject to the control and direction of the Lodge, except those actions and decisions pertaining to an employment relationship and the fixing of prices for goods and services.

Proposed Change: Add a new sentence:

The Chairman of the House Committee, with approval of the Exalted Ruler, may select up to two "ex-officio" members to participate in House Committee meetings or activities with full voice but no vote.

Committee Logic: 5 years ago this committee had 13 members. The drop to seven seemed too severe to some members, so this allows some additional help without requiring it. The choice of whether to add members will belong to each House Committee Chairman and Exalted Ruler.

Current Language: Article X FEES AND DUES

Section 1: The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant shall be \$50.00, to accompany the proposition.

Proposed Change: (Add three sentences)

Section 1: The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant shall be \$50.00, to accompany the proposition.

The Lodge shall have a reduced initiation fee of one dollar (\$1.00) for the months of October and March.

Members joining in March under a reduced initiation fee must pay their annual dues for the next Lodge year prior to initiation. Initiation Fees are waived for Active Duty members of any Branch of the Military. Dues must be paid prior to Initiation through the following March when initiation fees are waived.

SPECIAL REPORT: 5 YEAR BY LAWS REVIEW & UPDATE, pg2

Committee Logic – This will give us a defined membership committee goal to make the Grand Exalted Rulers Initiation Class in October, and the end of the year push for membership by the State President, as large as possible. The caveat for prepaying the next years dues is to ensure we are not left paying Per Capital on a lapsed member who came in for \$1.00 or less. These changes are offered by Grand Lodge for each lodge's consideration.

Current Language: Article X FEES AND DUES

Section 2

B. The regular Lodge Dues shall be \$75.00 per year, which shall not include the Grand Lodge per Capita fee, the Grand Lodge per capita insurance assessment, and State Association dues.

Proposed Change: (Increase the dues)

B. The regular Lodge Dues shall be \$80.00 per year, which shall not include the Grand Lodge per Capita fee, the Grand Lodge per capita insurance assessment, and State Association dues.

Beginning in the 1018-2019 Lodge year, annual dues will be \$80.00. Dues will increase by \$1.00 per annum for the next four years.

Committee Logic: Current Dues are not sufficient to pay the basic bills. Electricity alone accounts for 76% of dues income. The increase is necessary, but not large enough to price anybody out of their membership.

Current Language: Article X FEES AND DUES

Section D

NONE

Proposed Change: (Add New Language)

D. ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP

Each Associate Member shall pay an annual fee in the amount of \$10.00 in advance.

Committee Logic: That is the same fee charged to life members to cover administrative costs.

Current Language: Article X FEES AND DUES

Section 3. The reinstatement fee for an Elk holding an Absolute Dimit from this Lodge shall be \$15.00.

Proposed Change: Increase the fee for reinstatements but not for transfers.

Section 3. The reinstatement fee for an Elk holding an Absolute Dimit from this Lodge shall be \$25.00.

Committee Logic: This will cover some of the postage costs incurred by the Lodge for renewals.

Current Language: Article XIII BILLS AGAINST THE LODGE

Section 2

Current section 2 is to be retained as section 4.

Proposed Change: Add recommended new language

Section 2: The Treasurer may pay recurring bills upon the approval of the Board of Trustees (or Board of Directors as may be applicable) without obtaining prior Lodge approval. Any such payment will be reported at the next Lodge meeting.

Section 3: The Treasurer may designate a specific member of the Board of Trustees (or Board of Directors as may be applicable), or chair officer, subject to Lodge approval, to sign Lodge checks in the Treasurer's absence. Any such designee shall be bonded in the same amount as the Treasurer.

(Renummer the section accordingly)

Committee Logic: This language has already been approved by Grand Lodge and makes sense. We currently have language added o section 1 that covers recurring bills, but we require the Treasurer to sign all checks. The current added on language cannot be carried forward under the new format.

House Rules: Changes proposed by the House Committee

Current Language:

8. No minors are permitted to be seated at the bar.

Proposed change:

8. Anyone seated at the bar must be of legal drinking age.

Current Language:

14. Checks in excess of \$50.00 above the purchase must be approved by a member of the House Committee or the Lodge Secretary. A member issuing a worthless check will have his/her check-cashing privilege suspended until the debt has been satisfied including payment of a worthless check fee as provided for by law.

Proposed change:

14. Checks in excess of \$50.00 must be approved by a member of the House Committee or the Lodge Secretary. A member issuing a worthless check will have his/her check-cashing privilege suspended until the debt has been satisfied. Debt will include bank fees plus 10% for Lodge handling.

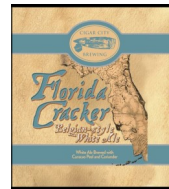

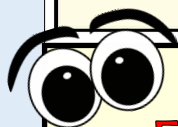
