

A SPECIAL DAY AT THE OPEN ARMS MINISTRY



FLORIDA STATE ELK ASSOCIATON OFFICERS - President, Carl Gerace, Vice President at Large Frank Maltesta, Chaplain Phil Gersbach, WCD Vice President Theresa Matthews, and State Secretary and COO Carl Seibert helped Tampa Elks feed the Homeless at Open Arms on Sunday, September 17th. It was the Tampa Elks week to serve as is every third Sunday. PER Courtney Taylor and her Dad and right hand man, Whiz, were in the kitchen bright and early, and shortly thereafter the regulars started filing in: Elma Kelly, Donna Halsey, Jacquie and Joe LoCicero, Patty Elkins, Laura Jones and me. The only major difference this month is that we all had just received a new, special apron with the State President's motto on it. There were less homeless than previous weeks, probably due to some finding special shelter during the hurricane. They may have been sheltered across town and not found their way back yet. Those 120 that did show up were, as usual, quite an interesting and mostly grateful lot. As the line wound down, one of the church members took the dignitaries on a special tour of the grounds, showing them the clothing closet, and the bicycle repair shop, among other hotspots. We receive our matching funds for that project from the FSEA — and I am glad they had the opportunity to see how those funds are helping our community.

Please keep in mind that they accept donations of nonperishable food, all clothing, but especially men's, travel size toiletries – like from hotels, any size towels or wash clothes, and those "paper or plastic" plastic bags. They also appreciate the plastic food tubs like ice cream, sour cream, or deli food items come in that you would otherwise throw away. Wash them and bring them with you to the lodge instead. Courtney or I will take them to the church.









2017 STAND DOWN

For the fourth year in a row, Tampa Elks participated in the Stand Down for Homeless Veterans put on by the James A Haley Veterans Administration with the help of the American Legion District 15 and community partners. This was the 2nd consecutive year that a hurricane disrupted the original plans and caused rescheduling.

The day before the event was spent washing and prepping lettuce, tomato and onions for the expected 600 hungry people. On the morning of September 22nd, Joe LoCicero, Elma Kelly and I arrived at America Legion Post 111 before 7:30 am to unload all of our supplies. By the opening ceremonies at 8:00. There were almost 100 Veterans in line waiting to get in the door. Business was very brisk at our booth first thing in the morning, and we were glad to have help from a friend at American Legion Post 139, Chaplain Linda Ziemack. Then Lecturing Knight Bert Newbill showed up to help, followed shortly by PER Brian Brantley. Whew! Things slowed down somewhat after 10 am, but we were still glad to see the second shift arrive before 11:00. Patty Jankiewicz, Carolyn Breit and Bonnie Atwood came in to relieve the morning crew and finish out the day. Brian Brantley stayed and made sure that the Lodge coolers and display board made it back safely. Even though the expected 600 did not materialize, more than 200 homeless Veterans were given supplies by Tampa Elks Lodge, and all the veterans and volunteers in the building were offered vegetables on their burgers.

Thank you to all the members who so generously donated cash or items to help make this happen.

These will be a group of Veterans, both male and female, that are in temporary housing while they get back on their feet after experiencing a bout of homelessness. Each Individual's circumstances are different, but they all have a few things in common. They all love to eat in a restaurant where they have choices. They all need friends. They all can use our support, in any way we can offer it to them.

When you spot them at the Lodge, please take a minute to greet them, encourage them to participate in dancing, a game of pool or to sing Karaoke with you...and, *please*, applaud like crazy if they find the courage to sing!

Remember, each of these Veterans at one point in their life offered to risk their life for our freedom. If you strike up a conversation, you will most likely find they could just as easily be your next-door neighbor or coworker. You may even find a new best friend. This little bit of socialization won't take much of your time or energy, but it could be what keeps them going through the long weekend at their housing facility. Remember the saying," So long as there are Veterans, the Elks will never forget them." (Dinner supported by our Freedom Grant)
