They are a 501C organization that has a 100 percent volunteer staff of Veterans and strong connections with the James A Haley VAMC Adaptive Sports Program and the United States Central Command Cares charities. Participants are usually picked by those two groups, based on the Veteran's physical and mental ability and needs. The CEO, Dave Winters, has a stellar reputation in the MacDill Community.

And, after working with him, I can certainly see why. Though Dave was not able to participate in either the Clay Shoot or the Fishing Trip due to work responsibilities, he had everything perfectly organized and both outing went off without a hitch. Dave did come to our 150th Gala to express his appreciation for our partnership.



The Clay Shoot event was funded by Black Dagger MHC, with the Tampa Elks Lodge helping with the lunches. The Fishing Charter and Eat your Catch dinner was funded by Tampa Elks Lodge, with Black Dagger MHC helping with the lunches. In February, 8 Elks joined 8 Veterans in a round of Clay Shooting – not all Elks tried to shoot, but we were there to watch how they interacted with the disabled Veterans, and we were impressed! Then in March, 16 Veterans were chosen to participate in a 8 hour Fishing Charter. They were accompanied and facilitated by 2 Elks and 2 staff members of Black Dagger MHC (All 4 Veterans). They had a great day on the water and brought back enough fish so that those that couldn't stay for dinner could take their fileted fish home, and the 9 that remained had enough fish to take into the restaurant to feed all 17 of us. The Elks that drove over to join them for dinner didn't expect to be eating their fish – but there was plenty of snapper and grouper to feed everybody! And it was obviously very fresh and delicious. You can be proud that Tampa Elks truly lives up to the saying, "So Long as there is a Veteran, the Elks will never forget them."
