



Meet our newest Vet in our Welcome Home family, Angel.

Angel served in the Army from 1995 until 2001.She fell upon some hard times just over a year ago and had to send her two kids to live with her cousin in DC. She was in our Lodge several times early this year as part of our Freedom Grant and was here for the Veteran's Committee dinner for the Domiciliary Vets on Shelagh's specialty sandwich night in July. She happily claimed a microwave and two bags of household items for her new home. Yes, after 6 months in the Tampa Domiciliary, Angel has now been re-housed. Best of all, her kids will be joining her in time to start school in Tampa this year!

I visited Angel in her new home, and I was very impressed by her industriousness and her good

taste. She has only the basics for her kitchen but has nice living room and dining room furniture. She even has a couple of brand new lamps she had put on layaway while in "The Dom." She is excited to be making a great new home for her children, but she can use our help!

She has bedroom furniture in the room she and her 12year old daughter will share but is waiting on the queen-sized box spring and mattress Tampa Crossroads is supplying, however she needs a full bedding set of sheets and comforter or bedspread.. A decent nightstand lamp and an alarm clock would be helpful, too. The room for her 17-year-old son is completely empty, and needs a whole bedroom set: bed nightstand, chest of drawers, desk, etc. She needs towels and washcloths for both the bathrooms and the kitchen, as well as kitchen bakeware, a can opener, a knife block, and other nonstandard kitchen tools. She had no cleaning supplies, so if you bogo....

She really is concerned about paper products, especially toilet tissue, paper towels, napkins and food wraps. Energy efficient light bulbs are another need. Her kids are flying down with a suitcase a piece – so they will need clothes for school. The 12year-old will need uniforms – she is about the normal size of a kid that just turned 12. The 17-year-old wears a size 9 shoe, 34/30 pants, and a large top. They both will need all school supplies – and quickly. Angel wears a 6 1/2 or size 7 shoe, size 10 pants and size large tops. She usually shops in the petite department, standing about 5'2". Angel bought a TV while in the DOM, but would like another Flat screen TV in the house, since there will be three of them. She had cable, but no internet. She had the VA's HUD-VASH voucher to make sure her rent and utilities are paid, but only a tiny income, at least until she starts school under the GI bill in December. If you can help Angel and her kids out, please contact Rita at the Lodge and she will plan for delivery of any donated items.





ELK's Special Announcement

Can YOU Help the Elks Be a Beacon of Hope to the Homeless in Tampa?

For the sixth year, Tampa Elks will partner with the Open Arms Ministry at Hyde Park United Methodist Church to offer a weekly Brunch to the up to 200 homeless men, women and children who show up at the church at 7:30 on Sunday morning looking for solace and sustenance.

As a partner, the Open Arms Ministry counts on the Tampa Elks for not just financial help and donations of used clothes and other items, but also for manpower. On the third Sunday of each month, Lodge Trustee Courtney Weil, PER, shows up at 6:30 AM to manage the kitchen for the day. Tampa LOE member, Elma Kelly, shows up next at about 7 AM to be there when the doors open to greet the homeless and make sure they sign in. From 7:30-8:00 more Elks arrive. Two more of our Elks are so dependable they have special jobs – Donna Hulsey is first in the serving line, handing out the eating utensils and napkins. Patty Volpe is second in line with wide selection of bread. Sometimes an Elk is asked to stay and assist in the kitchen, but most of the other Elks find a place on the serving line where they will spoon up some encouragement along with the eggs, grits, meat, casseroles, vegetables, salads, fruits and desserts. We sure are glad when we get a good number of Elks in the building! You can also invite a friend or bring your children if they are old enough. The food is served cafeteria style, and the "customers" can come back for seconds after everyone has been served.

Additionally, Elks and church members carefully wash and donate "red neck Tupperware." You know – those plastic containers that would end up in the trash after you eat the contents. Cottage cheese, butter, take out or deli meals – all that plastic can be recycled into carry out containers for the homeless to use to take out any leftovers.

You can also recycle your clean, untorn plastic grocery bags through this project. Those have a multitude of uses. They are not only used in the food service area, but also in the clothing closet that is open on the first Sunday each month. I don't know why I call it a closet – It is actually a twobedroom house. Both bedrooms are lined with shelves. One bedroom is for women's clothing and the other one for men's clothing. Donations of clothing, shoes, accessories, toiletries, towels, blankets and backpacks are another easy way for Elks members to get involved. The crew that sorts the donations works on Thursday mornings from about 9until noon' and is always glad for extra help.

On any given Sunday you may find a fellow Elk or two at the church helping out, but on the Third Sunday we hope to see YOU! The address of the church is 500 W Platt St, Tampa Fl 33606. The volunteer parking lot is at the corner of Magnolia and Azeele. Go into the door closest to that corner. It is marked KITCHEN, and right inside that door you will find Courtney. Just say, "I am an Elk and I am here to help." You will be glad you did.
