## My Final Message

A year ago this message seemed a light year away, but as I reflect it has gone by quickly. I am very thankful to you all for having the faith in me to be the ER of our lodge this year. I consider it a privilege to have been able to serve an organization that has been of service to our nations communities for 150 years and that stands for all the principles that have influenced my life in so many ways...Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity.

We have been able to continue supporting our Nation's Veterans with James Haley Monthly Bingo Program and dinners. The V.A. Domiciliary has benefited from a Freedom Grant. The Welcome Home kits have assisted at least 6 vets get into independent living. The Black Dagger Veterans have been helped with a grant. We sent our own member Jack Johnson to the Parade of Heroes in Washington DC. We have sustained our relationship with Athena House for Women and we hosted a wonderful Red White and Blue Event featuring a Bluegrass fundraiser for the Veterans.

Community Children have enjoyed a wonderful "Back to School" party and a Christmas party. We sent 60+local children to our Youth Camp and the lodge had four (4) of our own young people working at the camp this summer as counselors. Club Chivalry at RHS continues to flourish with the help of the Impact Grant and it's making a difference in the kid's graduation success rate. Westshore Elementary will be the recipient of a grant to provide food for the Kids to take home for Spring Break (feeding little tummies). The "Just Say No" program continues to promote drug awareness and helps the area kids stay away from drugs.

Our relationship with the Open Arms Ministry for the Homeless benefits from the monthly meals, a special Thanksgiving and Christmas Dinner along with the clothing we are able to supply.

We were able to join in the WCD partnership with Walgreens for a toy drive that helped benefit some of the local children's charities with Christmas presents and we hope this will be an ongoing program.

We started informative programs for our members to enjoy: Social Media, Linked In, Social Security Benefits, YMCA Activities to help keep you healthy. Painting with a Twist, Breast Cancer Awareness, and now the new Crafting group, to educate and entertain. We hoped that you have been able to benefit from these programs.

We celebrated our 150th Anniversary of the BPOE with a memorable tribute to our organization and to 708. We were given proclamations from the Mayor of Tampa and the Board of County Commissioners that recognize our Order for all of the good works that we do for our Nation and Community.

The lodge has been busy thanks to you, the members who have helped to make all of this happen. Congratulations to our new ER Elect Dee Cisneros and the new slate of Officers- they will serve you and the lodge well. I hope you will support them in their endeavors as they manage our lodge.
