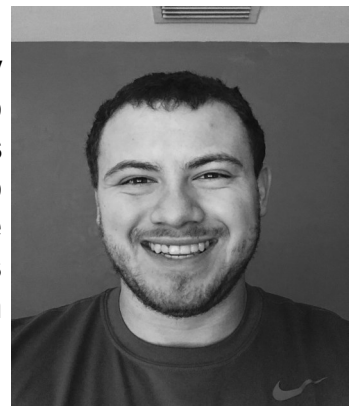
ELK OF THE MONTH:

Club Chivalry News

The regular club Day meeting for Club Chivalry was scheduled for April 9th. Since it was the last meeting of the school year, I was dismayed to find I would be out of town. Luckily for me, some good Elks stepped up to handle things. Carolyn Miller, Elma Kelly and Bert Newbill attended the meeting and handled the refreshments and raffles. Courtney Weil, daughter Capriana Sanchez, and son Taylor Taylor attended as guest speakers. The meeting was very successful, with the students in the club particularly relating to the younger Elks' message about bullying and domestic violence. That awesome Elk family trio, often accompanied by daughter Christina, have been making the rounds of high schools and their speeches are impacting young lives across Tampa Bay. I am so proud of these Elks, and grateful they could accommodate our Club Chivalry this year.



The very next day, while I was still out of town, we had what may have been the best field trip yet. After making sure all the Club chivalry attendees had breakfast, they loaded the bus at 8 AM and headed downtown to the Straz Center for Performing Arts. Billed as the 2018 Build Tampa Bay Event, this initiative is in its 3rd year and getting bigger and better. More than 1000 students from across Tampa Bay had the chance for one on one meetings with employers ready to hire the students directly from high school and offer them full 4 year scholarships. The students would work full time and attend classes 2 nights a week. They would begin as laborers, but in 4 years they would be Journeymen or experts in their field. Besides one on one meetings, There were some amazing motivational speakers. John Ratzenberger, the actor from Cheers, spoke about how he was a carpenter and had peace of mind because could always fall back on that skill if his acting career fizzled out. Sally C Harris, local school board member, spoke about how she was penniless when she started out in early education but she just kept learning and earning. One of the speakers pointed out all the teachers in the audience, and told the students that in 4 years they could be earning more than their teacher. The teachers did not disagree.

This field trip was a replacement for our normal visit to HCC and USF. The school would not approve a second absence during the final quarter. And Amazingly- The event sponsors paid for our student's lunch and the bus! That is a big savings for our club. The volunteer chaperones – Tommy Moore, Laura Jones, and Antonio Cruz, were very impressed and hope that we can repeat this trip next year., since it is a perfect fit for our demographic.

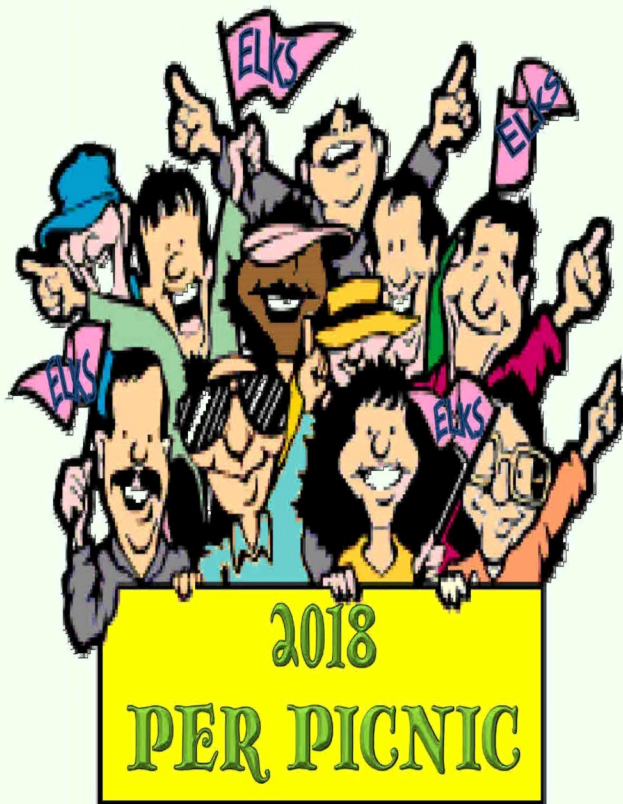

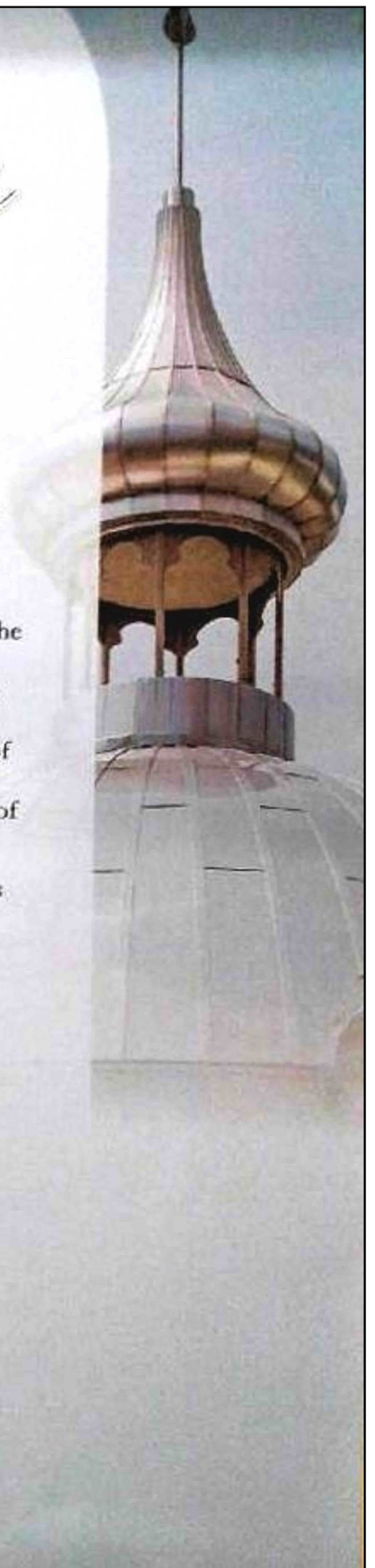
