ENF awards lodges that make their per member contribution goals to the Elks National Foundation Trust Fund receive a gratitude grant. We have been eligible and make good use of it each year. This grant has very few restrictions. Here in Tampa, we try to pick a local Charity and have some fun with them!

This year, at the suggestion of new member Walter Seward, we chose



to partner with the Dream Center of Tampa. The Dream Center is a faith- based youth program and facility that offers programing for grade k-12 after school and on no school days. It is located in North Ybor on N 15th Street – right around the corner from the Athena House. They bought and renovated an old Boys and Girls Club building. The Dream Center emphasis service to God, family and your neighborhood. The Dream Center is associated with Grace Family Church.

After meeting with the Director, Chris Davis, we decided to plan a field trip for the teenagers that are in the leadership training program.



These teens are being utilized as mentors for the younger children and aspire to be future community leaders. Since every other organization that comes in to help wants to work with the young kids, they were quite agreeable when we suggested doing something with the teens. When I mentioned taking them to an escape room, the die was cast. Mr. Davis had been to an escape room as part of team building in the past, and he was fully aware of how much it could hep his teens and his program work more cohesively. We sweetened the pot by including a nice dinner where they could show off their newly learned etiquette skills.



On Wednesday, February 20th, we set off in the bus owned by the Dream Center. We arrived at Spain Restaurant om North Tampa at 5:00. They had prepared a table and a price fixed menu for us. In total, there were 19 at the table. PER Courtney Weil and new 21-yearold Elk Christien Elkins joined me as chaperones. Each person had a nonalcoholic beverage, a salad, and entrée



and dessert. Tax and gratuity were also included so we were able to settle the bill and get out of there just in time at 6:30. We walked to the Great Escape room, but we walked the long way because I was giving backwards directions. Luckily, they were young and healthy and the extra 10-minute walk through downtown did not faze them. We arrived at the Escape room before our 7:00 appointment, then after signing releases we divided the group in half and off they went to two game room themed escape rooms. I did not Participate in the escape since there was an uneven number. Both teams had a great time, but only one team made the escape. We were back at the Dream Center in time at 9:00.







Anniversary Grant two-part project completed



During the 2018 – 2019 Elk year we were again offered the opportunity for an Anniversary Grant as the BPOE continued our 150th Year Celebration. This Grant encouraged lodges to actively pursue a project but did allow Lodges to simply donate to a local cause if they preferred. In Tampa, we split the grant and did both!



First, at new member Shannon Wheatly's suggestion, we partnered with the local charity, "It's My Bag." This charity collects luggage, backpacks and other supplies for children in Foster Care. It is not just a joke, but a harsh reality, that most of foster children enter the system with all their belonging in a big plastic trash bag. That tends to send a message that their belongings, and their lives are worthless. We hope to change that message.

We chose the dates of January 19th to the 21st and hooked up with the Dr Martin Luther King Jr Day of Service website. We also advertised on the South of Gandy Facebook page. Of course, Tampa Elks were our big-



gest contributors, but those other sites did garner quite a bit of attention and a lot of donations.

In total we collected 110 pieces of luggage; 6 cases of school binders; 22 bars of soap, 7 body lotions 4 body wah 2 shampoos, 1 conditioner, 5 facewash, 3 toothpaste; a twin sheet set, and 13 luggage tags. We consolidated the collection by packing the smaller bags into the larger bags, and two vehicles showed up to haul them to the Joshua House, a local facility that has a never-ending stream of foster children filling their 35 beds.

Thank you to each person that donated, and a special shout out to Shannon Wheatley, Bonnie Atwood, Patty

Volpe, and ER Dee Cisneros for taking on extra duties to make it all happen.

The second part of the Anniversary grant was a large \$1000.00 donation to the Medal of Honor Society Convention Tampa Bay 2019 Fund. Linda Reid hooked us up with this auspicious committee in November, and we were glad hat ENF could help us help them make their convention successful. Medal of Honor Recipient Gary Litrell, who is the official Host of this year's Tampa Convention, came with his team to the Lodge for a photo op with the Lodge Officers and Linda Reid. We hope to expand on this relationship with future donations. If you would like to contribute, the office will accept checks made out to Medal of honor Society Convention Tampa Bay 2019. We will forward them for you. They are a 501C3charity and the tax number is available in the office.
