# FAMILY LITERACY AT BRIDGEPREP K-8

On February 24th Tampa Elks 708 partnered with the private charter school BridgePrep K-8 to have a Family Literacy night. This project was funded by FSEA matching grant funds. Author David Green was hired

to bring his children's comic books and read them to the students. This event took place in two phases; at 3:00pm all the middle school students were issued books and spread out on the lawn to read along with the author. They also received posters, bookmarks and autographs from the author himself. At 4:00pm, the elementary school families were invited to attend a similar, safe, outdoor event. Twenty-eight families were present with their student and the children attending the after-school care program also joined in. Each child received a book package, a drug





awareness (DAP) coloring book as well as a bookmark and participated in the read along with the Author. Autographs were given upon request. In addition, Tampa Elks #708 provided cardboard picture books for the toddlers that came with their families.

The Elks' participation included the purchase of all the books and supplies, the refreshments, and of course the volunteers to make it all come together. Thank you to *Shelagh Gombarcik*, *PER*, *Laura Jones, Treasurer, Bonnie Atwood, Patty Volpe, Richelle Nickle, Mike Volpe, and Christien Elkins* for giving up their afternoon to help these children develop a love of reading. *Christine Harris* is the principal of BridgePrep and a long time Elk herself. # Happy New Year to Club Chivalry!



Tampa Elks Lodge #708 has been granted our 6<sup>th</sup> Impact Grant to be used by Club Chivalry for Successful Students. The Impact Grant year runs January to December, and all expenditures are reported directly to the Elk's National Foundation for verification and approval. This year the amount of the grant was only \$4000. In the ENF

Midday Minute, a weekly U-Tube production by ENF, they explained that Impact Grants in existence more than 3 years are expected to find other means of support for the program, and the amount of the grants will be steadily reduced until the programs are self-sufficient. You know what that means? Fundraising time. In a normal year this program, with the field trips, school supplies, and T-shirts, costs about 11K. Luckily, or not, this has so far not been a normal year, so our current expenses are much lower. That is



expected to change quickly as the Covid situation improves. Donations are always welcome, and in March there was a special meeting of Club Chivalry supporters to brainstorm fundraising ideas for the year.



We had our first meeting of the Impact year on January 26<sup>th</sup>. Our motto for the Month of January was, "Success usually comes to those who are too busy to be looking for it." Lecturing Knight Paula Rousselle was our guest speaker, and she kept the students interested in how she developed her career as a Civil Defense Trial Attorney. Our other volunteers, Shannon Wheatly, Bonnie Atwood, and Carolyn Miller were also appreciated as they helped with the refreshments

and clean up. The kids took a Valentine's quiz to fill in the few minutes left before the final gift card drawing.



At our February 22nd meeting, *Bonnie Atwood*, *Carolyn Miller*, *and Elma Kelly* were our volunteers. The students were shocked to hear that Elma was 90 years old and still volunteering! Our motto for the month was, "*The fastest way to achieve success is to first help others succeed*," *Shannon Wheatley* was our guest speaker. She told the children about her winding path to her current career as a small business owner. The students were surprised to hear that Shannon is the owner and operator of The Fun Boat. After some announcements, the students, and Elma played an elimination game that requires quick reflexes.

# MAKING MUPPIFS AT THE MIDDLE SCHOOL





On Saturday, January 23rd at 9 o'clock in the morning Tampa Elks assembled at Coleman Middle School to embark on a landscaping project with the students in the Beta Club, courtesy of our Elks National Foundation's oversized 2021 Beacon grant. These students are required to earn 10 hours of community service, retain a GPA of 3.5 or higher and get two teacher recommendations to even join the National Beta Club. These were highly motivated and well-disciplined students, and a real treat to work with. While Coleman is not a particularly impoverished school, the county's budget for maintenance has necessarily been cut due to the increase cost of maintaining Covid precautions. The school was looking rather shabby. Fellow Elk *Kristina Chowning* is the

Beta Club sponsor, and she was able to determine the scope of the project and the supplies needed. She also knew exactly how to organize the morning, and assigned each Elk to a different point in the schoolyard and set us to work. In total 75 students signed in! We had 11 Elks: 2 food runners, a photographer, 2 hydration station/lunch helpers and 6 that really rolled up their sleeves. They all had to have applied online to become a school volunteer in order to participate. There were also a couple of other teachers, a couple of PTA parents, and the Principal on board that morning.

Projects varied: *Tommy Moore* drew the pressure washing job, which included supervising students who were applying sod to the picnic area grounds. *Jerry Reid* spent a couple of hours with a rake in his hand.

*Elma Kelly, Laura Jones, and Linda Reid* transformed planters into works of art. I never did find *Shannon Wheatley*, but I heard she was way out front with a group of kids. It was my first time on campus and I really didn't know where out front was. However, Shannon was done early also, and luckily had an extra case of water in her car. It was quite warm for January!

Other adults supervised students planting shrubs along the walkway and weeding out a bed of ferns. With that many students, all the projects were done early, so we went across the street and tackled the track and basketball court too!

By noon, the students were tired, dirty, and hungry. Unfortunately, Subway Sandwich Shop let us down that day. I made arrangements with two Subways in advance. I talked to the manager and verified they had all the ingredients I had listed on the form from which the students would choose. *Jan Bertoch* took the orders to the Subway Sandwich Shops right at 10 o'clock when they opened. When *Shelagh Gombarcik* arrived at 11:30 to pick them up, they hadn't even started on the orders. At 12:50pm about half the sandwiches arrive. By then many students had left after filling up on chips, cookies and fruit. By 1:00pm all the students had been picked up and all the Elks needed a shower!




# 2021 St Patrick's Party





### BAR RENOVATION PLANS

The Bar Renovation Committee is continuing to develop plans, gather estimates and move toward work on the bar. Under consideration is a phased plan to address the following:

- Bar interior, including new sinks....plus hand washing sinks, replacing the center island, and addressing other mechanical needs, plus replacement of the entire "gun" system by Coke.
- Bar top, with consideration of everything from new Formica to possible acrylic/epoxy finishes and other options.
- Bar face redo with metal and wood finishes being considered.
- Replace the carpeted area around the bar with either new carpet or possible vinyl or composite materials with a wood grain finish.
