


ELK OF THE MONTH...MARTY QUIRE

WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA TAMPA



On Monday Oct 4th Tampa Elks Lodge 708 made a \$500.00 donation to the Wreaths across America program at the only privately owned Veteran Cemetery in the country: The American Legion Cemetery that sits on the property at Kennedy and Dale Mabry next to the U.S.S. Tampa American Legion Post 5.

There are over 800 graves in the cemetery, with Veterans having been buried between 1899 and 1995. On December 18th, starting at 11 AM, Post 5 will join every National Cemetery in the country in placing a wreath on each soldier's grave, at an expense of over \$11000. The public is invited to attend a brief ceremony and take part in placing a wreath on a grave.







The 2022/2023 application period is open now, with applications due by January 10, 2022 To apply go to Floridaelks.org/scholarships

The mission of the Florida State Elks Association HOPE Scholarship is to provide financial support for the educational needs of Florida high school seniors without which they would not be able to achieve their educational goals

. The scholarship targets students who demonstrated leadership through participation in school activities, community service, and citizenship. Consideration is given to those students who have shouldered extra responsibility such as working throughout their high school careers to help provide support of siblings or family.

Students Targeted:

The HOPE Scholarship is open to students who have maintained a minimum of a 2.3 to 3.3 unweighted GPA. Students with an un-weighted GPA above 3.3 cannot apply. We are looking for students who have demonstrated leadership through employment, participation in school activities, community service, and citizenship. Special consideration is given to those students who have shouldered extra responsibility such as working throughout their high school career to help provide support for siblings or family.

Program Eligibility Overview

- Must be a student in graduating class of high school or its related equivalent
- Applicants entering Law Enforcement, Fire, or Correction academies (within 5 years of high school graduation).
- Seniors graduating at semester (December) must apply during application year before they graduate
- Must be a resident of the state of Florida

Must be a United States citizen


