#### A NOTE FROM YOUR LECTURING KNIGHT

The Eleven O'clock Toast is something all Elks members, throughout our country, are familiar with and hold dear to our hearts. It symbolizes our remembrance of absentee members. But truthfully how many really do know what the toast says? I am fortunate since many of you are aware that my father Richard, (Dick) Dayes was District Deputy in 1992- 1993 and an Exalted Ruler at the South River Lodge in New Jersey at the age of 32. I grew up as a young child going to Elk picnics, enjoying the Children's Christmas parties with their visit from Santa, and even waiting on Lodge tables as young as 13. My daughter, Crystal (fourth generation Elk) has been fortunate to have similar experiences at this lodge.

What is my concern? I feel that when a member passes away, the family or loved ones', may not be aware of the protocol at our Lodge. If the family would like the Lodge to be aware of the passing of their loved one, they will need to contact the Lodge secretary and advise him/her of the passing as well as the time and location of the visitation or funeral, should there be one.

Furthermore, the Elks have a beautiful ceremony that is performed by the Lodge officers, if the family requests it. My grandfather, Harold (Happy) Dayes was the chaplain at the South River Lodge, and he was active in the Tampa Lodge in the 1980's. When he passed away, the Elks were there for my family, and several members even took time off from work to be there. I can recall my father saying how impressed he was that so many members cared.

I recognize that everyone grieves in a different way, and it is a personal choice if you would like to have a service performed at the Lodge or not. However, I can tell you from personal experience that we are there for you and more than willing to be supportive in your time of need. (You may be referred to the Hall Rental Chairman to find an open date.)

# National Convention Report Rita Smith – Exalted Ruler

It was my honor to serve as your representative at the Grand Lodge Convention in Atlanta from July 2<sup>nd</sup> -July 6<sup>th</sup>. The statutes make attendance mandatory. Once you have attended a convention as an ER, you are forever considered a member of Grand Lodge and eligible to vote. Members who have not yet attained the rank of ER are excluded from certain sessions of the Convention.

Shelagh Gombarcik, PER accompanied me. I had accompanied her when she was the ER in 2017.

Traveling on Friday was as bad as predicted; our arrival in Atlanta was 5 hours later than expected and we had not eaten. After checking into the hotel, I practically ran to a little restaurant on Peachtree Blvd for some dinner. Sweet Georgia's Juke Joint's food did not disappoint, though the service was under par.

Saturday night we attended the Wonderful West Central District Deputy's ER Dinner at historic Mary Macs in Midtown. Besides the Exalted Rulers from each of the 8 lodges and District Deputy Tom Moran and his wife Cindy, other dignitaries from our District were in attendance. PSP's Frank Palladini and Rudi Masi with Dolly, State COO Carl Seibert and DDGER Theresa Seibert. DDGER Tony Fratella, with Marilyn and Isabella, DDGER Jeanne Rinehart, DDGER Joanne Matos with Robert were all included. We had a private room, a delicious buffet dinner and a history lesson on the restaurant, chosen by Rudy.

Sunday morning we got down to the convention center plenty early so that we could register and go through the exhibits before Opening Ceremonies. There were less displays but more venders, and within a couple of hours I had my hands full and my wallet empty. The opening ceremonies were just that – a string of Ceremonies, broken up a bit with videos from Elks National Foundation. It was open seating, so I made sure to get a front row seat. It only lasted two hours, but it was very impressive.

The next three mornings I had to meet DDGER Tom Moran in the lobby by 7 AM to board a bus for the convention, which starts at 8 each day. The most important part of the convention is the voting on Resolutions. They are presented on Monday, voting is done Tuesday, and results are released on Wednesday. For the first time in years, all 11 resolutions passed. *The most immediate change that will affect our lodge is that effective August 5<sup>th</sup> the Secretary and the Treasure are part of the Board of Directors.* The other 10 have been read at the lodge meeting and will be printed in the forthcoming State and Grand Lodge magazines. They are also available at Elks.org.

The convention sessions were over by noon each day - but then there were some top-quality classes available. Shelagh and I each took advantage of those. My favorite was the All-American Lodge Contest A and the Americanism essay contest class. Shelagh concentrated on ENF classes.

Most afternoons I opted for napping instead of sightseeing. It was unbearably hot, and just attending the convention took 2 miles of walking each day. In the evening, the Florida State Elks Association kept us busy with hospitality rooms and the Florida Dinner. We watched the fireworks at Centennial Park through the Hotel room windows on July 3<sup>rd</sup>.

I have been to a lot of big conventions in a lot of cities. This was my 5<sup>th</sup> Elks convention. The part that Elks could control – The actual convention and related events – were well run with a good mix of business and braggadocio. The downside was that the city was not prepared for the influx of visitors, resulting in long lines and longer wait times for dinner tables. And we know why they call it Hotlanta!

The left-over prizes will be utilized at our next Lodge fundraiser: A Quarter Auction on November 20<sup>th</sup>.












# Past Festivities & Events
