

TAMPA 708 STATE OF THE LODGE

Tampa Elks Lodge #708 State of The Lodge 2021-22

THE STATE OF TAMPA ELKS LODGE #708 IS SOUND.

The working members of Tampa Lodge, bolstered by an aggressive new cadre of younger members and driven by our long-term leaders, have carried the Lodge through to a financial and membership year of growth.

Tampa Elks Lodge #708 has just experienced the second year-in-a-row of a near-complete upheaval in Lodge activities, schedules, etc. primarily due Covid. The Lodge this year bounced back from a year of unavoidable negatives to complete a year of positives, and in some cases outstanding and once-in-a-lifetime opportunities. These have produced both a very nice growth in the Lodge membership, reversing several years of static or negative growth, and a very positive financial year, again reversing several quite trying years of loss or break-even situations.

GRAND LODGE

I am pleased to report that Tampa Lodge carried off the Visit of more than 6,700 Elks to our community, and about half that number passing through the Lodge over a nine day period. Our 40-strong list of members, officers, and bartenders did a yeoman's job of pleasing almost every visitor. The comments positive about our Lodge, its members, and the friendliness were many. The long months of preparation, Lodge and Bar Renovation, etc. paid off handsomely as the Lodge produced a sizeable income, replenishing the coffers nicely. The unfortunate illness of several, and the exhaustion by the many following this massive event were an almost-predictable side bar to the success.

ALL AMERICAN LODGE

In July, at Grand Lodge, Tampa Elks Lodge #708 was honored as one of three Lodges in Florida recognized by the Grand Lodge as an All American Lodge for the previous year. The honor of such a designation is great. Our hard-working membership can well be honored to receive such an award.

GASPARILLA 2022

Returning to a more "normal" year the 22nd annual Gasparilla Boat Parade celebration was held by Tampa Elks Lodge #708. More than \$6,000 was added to the coffers of the Lodge with more than 40 Lodge members working to provide a great day of fun for attendees from Zephyrhills, Aripeka, New Port Richey, Largo, St. Petersburg and Tampa East RV Center. There were nearly 140 attendees. A grand time was held by all, despite the chill winds and low temps.

MEMBERSHIP GROWTH

Tampa Elks began the Lodge year with 304 members. We will end the year with nearly 380 members, a net growth rate of 25% after removal of delinquents. The success was brought about by a strong effort from both existing members and the steady work by our Membership Committee led by PER Chris Miles.

AWARDS

This year has marked several awards received by Tampa Elks Lodge #708. Leading the pack, as mentioned earlier, is 3rd place, DIV II, All American Lodge. Often overlooked, but still important is our 1st Runner Up award for All State Lodge. An award I am most proud of is Highest Per Capita donations for Harry-Anna Trust Fund at \$36.5686. There are other awards likely as the year winds down.

FINANCES

During this Lodge year our accounts increased by \$32,000. It has been a very positive year primarily due the VERY HARD WORK by the many volunteers on the Grand Lodge visit and Gasparilla.

SUMMATION

We should, I feel move to complete several improvements to the Lodge, using our new money. Included for consideration and possible fund-raising are a new floor for the Lodge Room, completion of Bar Renovation with a new bar top, and a replacement program for dining room furniture. A committee of mixed new and old members should be formed to plan future improvements.
































Grant Reports















Tampa Elks 708 in conjunction with the Tampa Humane Society held its first ever Pet Adoption Event and Pet Show funded with a Gratitude Grant.

Elks and people from the community came to show off their pets, and many dogs and cats walked the runway to compete for prizes in various categories such as Fluffiest Pet, Friendliest Pet, and Best Animal Trick. Every pet attendee was given an Elks "Adopt, Don't Shop" bandana and treats, and refreshments were served to pet owners and volunteers. The Tampa Humane Society brought 3 dogs that were up for adoption, and their speaker outlined the services that the Humane Society provides and the importance of spaying and neutering pets. One sweet dog found her forever home that day.

It was a fun event that allowed Tampa Elks 708 and members of the community to come together in their love of animals and provide connections to those in need. Various Pet contests – smallest, largest, fluffiest, etc. were interspersed with guest speakers and Pet Trivia. Gift cards were given for the Pet contests, and there was a prize table for the trivia winners. All remaining gifts and funds were donated to the Humane Society of Tampa Bay. Members of Lodge 708 also donated hundreds of pounds of dog and cat food and other supplies to the Humane Society. The balance of the gratitude grant, which includes some generous cash donations, will be presented to the Humane Society at a later date.



Club Chivalry will Relay!

The school club- Club Chivalry for Successful Students – has formed a team called Club Chivalry for the American Cancer Society's *Relay 4 Life*. This event will take place on the Robinson Football Field, Home of the Robinson Knights. This year's theme is Champa Bay, so we will be decorating our shade tent accordingly. For our Club, they look to us. Each student






