


ELK OF THE MONTH...JOSE REMON

Before leaving, I handed Ms. Hand a large box of granola bars, since the students had their lunch break so much earlier than normal and might get hungry before the end of the day.

Our next Club meeting is on October 10th. We will be bringing in an Elk speaker- Robert Maloney. Our next field trip is a doozy - a 12-15 hour trip to Tallahassee to tour FA&M & FSU. Volunteers must be registered with the Hillsborough County School Board as a Daytime supervised volunteer.



Nomination for Honorary Lifetime Membership Theresa Seibert, PDBGER

She also has another daughter who was recently married living close by and her only son, also a member of Tampa Elks Lodge, joined the Coast Guard and quickly got certified as a Boatswain Mate and is now stationed in California. Theresa's widowed mother, who is also a Tampa Elk, lives in her Tampa home full time with the two cats, while Theresa travels back and forth the between the Tampa Condo and the home she and Carl share in The Villages.





Theresa is also a highly active Elk. Her father was an Elk, and Theresa frequently participated in the youth programs as a child, as have her children. Theresa has been a member for 26 years. She is active in the Florida Ladies of the Elks, attending every convention, and served as a Tampa LOE President twice, retaining the title of PLP. Theresa researched and implemented a Queen of Hearts program at the Lodge, which has helped stabilize both the kitchen and the lounge sales and brings in additional operational income too. Theresa started a program with a for-profit Bingo Hall where they donate some of their proceeds each month to the Harry-Anna Investment fund on behalf of Tampa 708. This program brings and average of \$800/month to Harry-Anna and has donated over \$40,000 since its inception in 2016 when Theresa was ER.

She had the foresight to start a Tampa 2021 fund – which is 100% donations - to help us prepare for the imminent convention. There were thousands of dollars on standby which funded many improvements throughout the lodge. Though not the duty of the Chairman of the BOD, Theresa has chaired our biggest events over the past years – including the annual FSEA convention committee and Gasparilla Invasion parties. The 2020 Gasparilla was the most successful ever – binging in over \$20,000 in much needed revenue.

Unfortunately, the next year the City of Tampa cancelled Gasparilla – twice! Luckily, Theresa had the foresight to apply for a forgivable PPP loan. Though money was tight, all our bills were current, and we made it through the year without touching our investment fund, the Partners in Progress (PIP).

Whenever possible, Theresa still finds time to participate in the Tampa Community Investment programs, especially Club Chivalry for Successful Students, the Impact Project she helped implement at her alma matter when she was the Exalted Ruler. Theresa was nominated to serve another five years as Trustee but had too much going on with her career and her children to be confident about committing the time necessary to the position.

This year she has become our Communications Commando, a new role that helps new members navigate the varied social media, email, and newsletters and web site. She has now agreed to step into the just opened position of Bylaws Chair, where her experience and foresight will help shape our Lodge for another 5 years. She maintains an unofficial advisory role and is always available for questions, advice and support. Her help is invaluable.

TAMPA 708 BY-LAWS COMMITTEE UPDATE

As per Grand Lodge Statute 17.060 "Not later than during the fifth year following the adoption of its original By-Laws and Rules of Order, or a general revision thereof, each Lodge shall prepare and file a current general revision of the By-Laws, Rules of Order, and House Rules. The Lodge shall use the latest form of By-Laws and Rules of Order prepared by the Grand Secretary, and house rules in a form approved by the Lodge. Any general revision of By-Laws and Rules of Order shall be accompanied by a general revision of House Rules." Tampa 708 By-Laws, Rules of Order, and House Rules were last approved by the Grand Lodge on November 27, 2017 and will need to have a general revision submitted to Grand Lodge for approval prior to November 27, 2022.

The By-Laws Committee is working on these changes now. We will have a copy of the By-Laws posted on the bulletin board for you to review. 
