"LOE" BYLAW CHANGES TO BE VOTED ON FEBRUARY 4TH

Article V - Dues

Section A: The membership dues shall be \$15.00 a year, payable by April 15. The dues shall be prorated to \$7.50 to anyone becoming a new member after December 1.

Recommended change: The membership dues shall be \$20.00 a year, payable by April 1 The dues shall be prorated to \$10.00 to anyone becoming a new member after December 1.

Section B: A member delinquent on dues for 3 consecutive months, after April 15, shall be dropped. She/he may be reinstated at any time she/he desires by paying a reinstatement fee of \$2.00 plus the \$15.00 dues.

Recommended change: A member is considered delinquent after May 15, shall be dropped from the rolls. She/he may be reinstated at anytime she/he desires by paying a reinstatement fee of \$5.00 plus their dues of \$20.00

Article VIII - Elections

Section C: The newly elected and appointed officer's installation shall be held at the discretion of the outgoing President and soon after the election. Officers shall assume their duties at the April business meeting.

Recommended Change: Section C: The newly elected and appointed officer's installation shall be held at the discretion of the incoming President and soon after the election. Officers shall assume their duties at the April business meeting.

Article IX - Duties of Officers

Section A: The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and Executive Board. The President shall perform the usual duties of the office, appoint committee chairpersons, and serve as "ex-officio" member on all committees. The president shall appoint the Chaplain and Parliamentarian. The President shall be entitled to expenses including up to 2 nights room, registration, and transportation to attend the Ladies' Conference. She/he shall be required to attend all LOE meetings and functions open to her/him at the conference and to report on them at the next meeting. In the event that two of the three eligible officers (President, Vice President, and Secretary) cannot attend, an alternate shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Executive Board.

Proposed change: The President shall be entitled to expenses including up to 2 nights room, registration and transportation to attend the Elks State (FL) Convention. In the event the President can't attend Elks State Convention an alternate shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Executive Board. The President shall be entitled to expenses including up to 2 nights room, registration, and transportation to attend the Ladies' Conference. She/he shall be required to attend all LOE meetings and functions open to her/him at the conference and to report on them at the next meeting. In the event that two of the three eligible officers (President, Vice President, and Secretary cannot attend, an alternate shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Executive Board.

Most Valuable Scholarship Update

The District Level judging for the Most Valuable Scholar contest ended on January 10th. There were 35 entries judged by 3 Elks from 3 different Lodges, and the aggregate score is used to determine who moves up. I have been forwarded the names of those who advanced to the State Level.




Club Chivalry Report






