
Ladies of the Elks Presidential Address





Playing Cards for Vets by Roger R. True, PGER Reprint from Grand Lodge Newsletter June 2010

Playing Cards for Veterans is a program that goes hand in hand with our Adopt-A-Veteran Program.

This activity will give a hospitalized veteran something to do rather than just passively sitting and watching television. These cards can also be distributed with your comfort care kits. They also can be a part of any activity for our veterans or active service men and women.

Through the dedicated and hard work of Brother Tom Jamison of Beardstown, Illinois Lodge No. 1007, who has made arrangements with several riverboats and casinos, we are now able to offer playing cards for our veterans to use. Last year, we distributed over 40,000 decks of playing cards to our veterans, valued at more than \$80,000. With the help of Elks volunteers, their spouses, family and friends, each deck of cards is checked to make sure all cards are in good condition and the deck is complete.

After the decks are checked, a "Playing Cards for Veterans" sticker with the logo of the Elks National Veterans Service Commission is placed on each deck of cards.

Sponsorship - a Rewarding Responsibility Rita Smith Membership Chair

Do you have a friend or relative that is interested in your Lodge Activities? Are you hesitant to take the first step to become their sponsor? It is not too hard to sponsor a new member. All you have to do is ask the bartender for an application, fill out the top, and have your candidate fill in their information. Then introduce your candidate to two of your Lodge friends who will agree to vouch for them, and have those two friends fill out their lines on the application. Attach a \$50.00 check, and turn it in to the Office, or to the house manager, James Harlow.

Once the Lodge Secretary has received the application with the fee, he will forward it to the Membership chair and the Investigation chair. If the investigation report comes back satisfactory, your name and your candidate's name will be forwarded to the Elksize Editor. At the first meeting of the month after publication, the members present at the Lodge meeting vote on accepting your candidate for membership.

If the vote is affirmative, your candidate will be mailed an invitation to Indoctrination, which is usually held the following Wednesday night. Be sure to have him/her contact you when he/she receives the letter, as you should attend Indoctrination with him/her. Your candidate will be much more comfortable with a familiar face in the room, and you will be asked to introduce your candidate to the officers present. By the end of Indoctrination, your Candidate has enough information to be initiated into the Lodge.

The Initiation Ceremony takes place at the second meeting of each month. (Exceptions can be made.) Again, you should plan on attending with your candidate, and will be asked to present his membership pin at the conclusion of the Ceremony.

At that point, you are officially a sponsor! But wait, your responsibilities aren't quite complete! Your Lodge also counts on you to make sure your new member gets involved in some activities or committees, and the best way to do that is to invite them along each time you head to the Lodge. It won't be long before they have met enough people that they feel comfortable showing up on their own! Now all you have to do is check up on them once in a while, answer any question they may have, and make sure they are having fun.

Your final responsibility is to make sure they have the new membership card each April! The Reward? You have your friend in the Lodge, another pair of hands to lighten the work load, and the eternal gratitude of your fellow Elks! Additionally, the Grand lodge offers awards for sponsorship, and I will discuss those next month.
