

You may have even heard that the Ladies of the Elks purchased a new convection oven for us. I am sure that you are as thankful as Rick and I are. The LOE has taken their attention and signature assistance to a new level this year, and I say that not because I share a bed with their President. All of the active and participating members have really stepped up and have been attentive to the needs of our Lodge with thankfully no strings or conditions attached. And what a year you had for fundraising and supporting charities! 
HOUSE COMMITTEE REPORT




ELKS MEMBERSHIP REPORT



JAMES HARLOW NOMINATED FOR HONORARY LIFE MEMBER

In accordance with 14.270, rules of our order, member, James C. Harlow, was nominated for Honorary Life Member by A.J. Matthews at the February 8th, 2012 regular Lodge meeting. This will serve as official notice that on March 14th, 2012, a ballot for election will be held to determine that nomination. James Harlow was elected to membership in Tampa Lodge #708 in 1985.

In April 2005, James Harlow was appointed as the Tampa Lodge #708 House Committee Chairman and Bar Manager where he served under five Exalted Rulers and received Elk of the Year honors that same year for his dedication, industry, and attention to detail.

Continuing his distinguished service to Tampa Lodge #708 and its members, James Harlow continued serving an additional term as House Man before serving as Bar Manager for four additional years under seven House Committee Chairmen. During his tenure, James Harlow's dedication and attention to detail caused him to respond to Tampa Lodge #708 daily where he tended to the financial transactions related to the kitchen and bar business, regular stocking of all beverages, inventorying food and kitchen products, and the occasional after-hours alerts from the Lodge alarm provider. During special events and scheduled banquets James Harlow regularly volunteered to man an additional bar, attended to necessary restocking, and remained available and on station until the conclusion of such events. Ever considerate of the financial health of Tampa Lodge #708, James Harlow researched and considered the addition of entertainment machines to the Antler room, therefore providing essential entertainment and funding of Lodge activities and charitable functions.

On numerous occasions and many times with short notice, James Harlow volunteered to serve as cashier for Thursday and Friday dinners and Sunday breakfast as well as acting as the sole source for training of bartenders and other service positions at Tampa Lodge #708. During his many years of service as the primary base of knowledge in identifying, procuring, and obtaining significant brands, styles, and types of adult beverages for Tampa Lodge #708 at the lowest possible cost, James Harlow religiously kept his eye on the bottom line to keep the Lodge operations profitable and accountable. This includes the introduction of credit card and automated teller machines for the profitability of the Lodge and the convenience of the membership. In participating as the Tampa Lodge #708 House Committee Chairman, James Harlow attended District Deputy meetings, functions, and used his personal time where he regularly offered valuable suggestions, opinions, and advice related to best practices to other Lodges within the West Central District. It is with respect and consideration for his many years of valuable and essential service to Tampa Lodge #708 that James C. Harlow is nominated to hold the title of Honorary Life Member.


