Club Chivalry

We had a busy November with Club Chivalry, even though our school sponsor, Caroline Hand, was ill for about a week. You just can't avoid the germs when you are in an enclosed classroom with five different groups of kids coming through during the day. Robinson is slated for an almost complete makeover, and hopefully an improved ventilation system will be included. This school is about 60 years old.

We had our Club meeting day while Ms. Hand was out sick. Her substitute graciously agreed to be our liaison for the day since all she had to do was be present. Tampa Elk's own Roshaun Gendrett was our guest speaker, and he spoke about what students need to succeed in school. He also explained the role of the school board. Roshaun was well received by the students. We distributed the Club T shirts, too. Thank you to Elma Kelly, Carolyn Miller, Tommy Moore, and Bonnie Atwood for volunteering.

Next up was field trip to Kaiser University. Ms Hand and Tommy Moore chaperoned the actual field trip from 9:30-1:30. Attendance was so low that I cancelled three volunteers. At 1:30, the bus pulled up to the school and Tommy was able to leave and I handled the rest of the day. We had ice cream, played games and had a cake walk in the cafeteria.

On the 18th, we sponsored an "on campus" field trip in conjunction with the Great American Teach In. Attendance was better, but not

great. We had breakfast at 8:30 in the cafeteria, followed by a couple of hours exploring careers in the gym. Thank you to Carolyn Miller and Edie Hanley for arriving so early. Next. we moved to the auditorium to listen to some great speakers – mostly Elks, of course. Patty Volpe, Youth Activities Chair, spoke about her "Journey in Life", and how she arrived at her career at CCS Medical. Shelagh Gombarcik, PER, talked about careers in the hospitality Industry, Betty Orcutt, PLP, told them about her route into nursing. Edie Hanley, Inner Guard, interested them in a career in the prison system, especially the possibility of early retirement. We had a last-minute substitution for our scheduled Realtor, who had to cancel. With no time left to get a volunteer approved, South Tampa Activist Stephanie Poyner was recruited by the PTSA president to talk about the rental availability in South Tampa and her campaign to halt the overbuilding. At my request, Shelagh gave one final, very short speech, about how having a third place where you have community, and a sense of belonging is good for your mental health. At 1:00, we had Chic-fil-et delivered from Uber eats. Unlike the last disaster with Subway Sandwiches, lunch arrived right on time!!! The kids had placed their orders at breakfast, so they were all pleased with their meals. The rest of the day was spent doing team building - the ice breaker game Who Am I?, a team trivia competition, the Cups reflex game, and then they all got to try to throw ping-pong balls

into a net on top of their teacher's head. Guess what they liked best?

There is no Club Day scheduled in December, since exams start on December 7th. The students voted to have a Christmas field trip instead of a gift this year. Pending ENF approval, that will be from 9:15-1:45 on December 6th. Both male and female volunteers are needed. We hope to have 40 students. Tolerance for noise will be more important than prolonged standing for this adventure. This will be the last month that this project is considered an Impact Grant. We have Beacon Grant funds available starting in January, and the Grow Impact account will be closed.




