




# COMING SOON TO YOUR ELKS LODGE

# Meet Andrew Finn, FSEA Employee and Happy Camper Hero

Andrew Finn is an IB Student at Robinson. He has been to the Florida Elks Youth Camp 3 times as a camper, and this year he was hired to work as a Counselor-in-Training. Prior to his employment, he started a project to collect toiletry items for the camp. This is especially important to him as the camp had provided what he had unfortunately forgotten to bring when he was a camper. He called his campaign the "Happy Camper Hero". This was a very personal mission for him, so when he failed to reach his goal, after soliciting his friends and family to contribute through a designated Amazon account, he reached out to Lodge Secretary Rick Schneider. He asked if his wish list could be distributed to the Tampa Elks Lodge members in the hope he could complete his mission.

After a brief investigation to make sure this Andrew Finn was legit, Rick decided that it would be more expeditious to just give him the cash to shop for the items locally. Rick made the motion at a Lodge meeting to donate \$250 from charity funds towards his mission. The motion passed, and Andrew was asked to appear at the Lodge to pick up the check. On May 16<sup>th</sup>, Andrew received the check from Secretary Richard Schneider and Exalted Ruler Paul Deland. We all enjoyed meeting this nice young man and were happy to have helped him achieve his goal.

To our surprise, on June 8, Secretary Schneider received another email from Andrew, this time he was asking how to give us a refund since he met his goal and had money leftover! He was instructed to donate it to the camp, which I am sure he did. This is the kind of character that spending time at the Elks Youth Camp instills in children. The Harry Anna Trust fund is what funds both the camp and the Florida Elks Children's Therapy services. Tampa was proud to accept a plaque for the highest per capita donations to Harry Anna at the recent convention.

Christina Sanchez spends every Wednesday afternoon working with the children at Community Stepping Stone Center. This center is just a couple of blocks from the Sulphur Springs Park and Pool, on North Nebraska. Last year we split our spotlight pandemic aid between two community centers, but this year we will focus on just this one to have a greater impact. The plan is to hold a Christmas in July event on July 27th, for 40 children. Each of these 40 kids, selected by the staff at the center, will receive a new pair of shoes, a package of socks, and some small toiletries. # Memorial Day on the River

Several months ago, we received a solicitation from Non - Profit Liberty Manor for Veterans to act as a sponsor for a canoe during the "The Greatest Race Ever" to be conducted on the Hillsboro River on Memorial Day.

Liberty Manor provides homes and services for veterans, but receives no direct aid from the Federal Government. These are usually Veterans who have fallen through the cracks. They live mostly independently, but under the one roof provided by Liberty Manor.

The Veterans Committee agreed to support it with \$500 from their reserved funds, and the Lodge chipped in \$500 of their charity funds, so we were in! Elk member *Joe LoCicero*, agreed to man the canoe for our team, and a Veteran from Liberty Manor was to be chosen to join him in the canoe.

Joe Locicero is a licensed mental health counselor who owns Green Fields Mental Health Services, an agency that is a state mental health provider and behavior analyst for the developmentally disabled. He was introduced to our Lodge through our scholarship program when his niece, Kendall Runyon, was a top 20 MVS scholar. She is now in graduate school. Joe is a faithful member of our Veteran's committee, and sometimes even a volunteer in the kitchen. His wife, Jacquie Locicero, is his office manager and the President of Tampa's Ladies of the Elks.

The Veteran paddling with Joe was John France. John is a Vietnam era Veteran who was determined to go to Vietnam. Though that was not his first station, he did eventually go and towards the end of his tour he was shot down. John was awarded the Bronze Star, Soldier Service, and the Purple Heart Awards. He has been diagnosed with Agent Orange related cancer in several organs, and but for Liberty Manor would be homeless. I suspect by next year he will be one of the soldiers remembered on Memorial Day.

Unfortunately, The Bay Area was in drought conditions on Memorial Day, so the Hillsborough River was way to low to safely accommodate planned launch site.

Connie and David Lindsay, who run Liberty Manor, are members of the Brandon Elks Lodge. They own some property which is not 501C3 and one of those properties is a large tract in Seminole Heights on the Hillsboro River. It was the planned finish line, but since their boat launch was still in the water, they changed plans to start and finish the race there.

We were blessed with a beautiful day, warm but with a breeze, and there was plenty of shade available. There were a couple of food trucks including one with salad options & Checkers French Fries-Free! They were grilling hot dogs and hamburgers – Free! Buckets of sodas and water – all free. Snacks, nuts, cookies, - whatever you could consume - Free.

All in all, it turned out to be a really nice afternoon. Even though our canoe did not win a prize, we were recognized for sponsoring the canoe. We raced in the nicest canoe on the river, too. If this becomes an annual event, I think we should stay with it! Next year, bring your family!




