Thank you to *Tommy Moore and Carolyn Miller* for assisting. We

only had time for a few announcements about the Field Day we had planned for Friday, and the meeting was over. Then on Tuesday, I got a call from Ms. Hand, fellow Elk and Club sponsor, which said the field trip was cancelled due to an increase in Covid Cases. All she could get approved was the Pizza Party for 6<sup>th</sup> period. And only 2 Elks could attend. (I also got an email from Westshore Elementary cancelling our upcoming events on that same day.) It was disappointing, to say the least. I recruited *Dee Cisneros*, PER, to join me and used the <u>Slice the Price</u> card from Domino's Pizza that Dee bought for the Lodge. I was not sure what to expect when I arrived at the school, but it turns out it was "Just" a pizza party and free time- there were no expectations for anything but full bellies from the 18 pizzas we provided. Mission accomplished! This year, we expect all the Seniors to graduate apart from one who disappeared from Virtual School the first few weeks of the school year. # THENKENG OUT OF THE BOX. THE SOAP BOX THAT ESPECT

Remember Suds and Stories? That was the 2019 Spotlight Grant that was scheduled for March 18, 2019.

That was the week when Mayor Castor shut Tampa down, so we have been storing the supplies in a member's shed, but that house has been sold, it is too hot to do our planned outdoor children activities, children still don't have vaccines, and we needed a plan B. Under the circumstances, the Staff at ENF that is in charge of the Community Investments funds allowed us to shift gears and create new projects to use the supplies for a charitable purpose. We partnered with Current Initiatives – a 501C3 organization that offers free laundry events all over the country. Our local connection, Jason, made it very easy on us – just show up with the supplies and quarters and 5-6 volunteers. This we did!

On Thursday, April 29<sup>th</sup> we facilitated 13 families using 44 washers to do the equivalent of 176 single loads. We provided pre-spray, liquid fabric softener, detergent pods, dryer sheets, laundry baskets or laundry bags, and unloaded laundry from cars, bicycles and wagons, put \$315.25 worth of quarters into machines, and folded loads of clothes for the busiest customers. Our clients ranged from a homeless man with one little bag to a single parent that had so many dirty clothes and bedding that she couldn't fit the laundry and her kids in her car together so had to make two trips.

Thank you to Tampa Elks Lodge volunteers *Robert Bordonaro*, *Susie Harlow*, *PLP*, *Peggi Tuttle*, *Betty Orcutt*, *PLP*, *Bonnie Atwood*, *Paula Rousselle*, *Loyal Knight*, *and Andrew Watt*, *ENF Legacy Scholar and grandson of Ted Bass*. The remaining quarters and all the leftover supplies were donated to the Current Initiative Laundry Project to hold another laundry day.

#### Mother's Day Ceremony




Sunday, May 9th our Lodge held it's annual Mother's Day ceremony. This was our new of lobason's first event and she

# Want to know what's happening at your Lodge for the upcoming National Convention? Read This!!

#### What should you expect?

Expect your Lodge to be a lot of fun, and also to need a little bit of help from you. The adage, "many hands make light work" has never been truer. You are needed and wanted. Show up, and you will be loved! If you have a pirate costume, wear it! If you don't have one we will have cool T-shirts for sale. Maybe you could assist with those shirt sales for an hour or two? Or spoon food onto plates? Or sell beer, bottled water or sodas from an ice bucket? Or just greet visitors as they arrive and give directions to the restroom? There are a lot of jobs: big and small, sitting, standing, walking, or talking. They are all important to show the Elks Nation that Tampa has what it takes to host a National Convention.

On July 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> the West Central District will be running a hop on, hop off shuttle bus between 4 Lodges: Tampa, St Pete, Seminole and Largo. Those are the busiest days, so please try to commit to helping at least one of them. It will be fun! On July 4<sup>th</sup> we plan a burger bar – the rest of the days will be Latin food.

Our ad in the National Elks Magazine reads..."Come join the Tampa Lodge #708 "Krewe of the Jolly Corks" for an adventure of a lifetime July 1<sup>st</sup> through July 9<sup>th</sup>, daily from noon until the 11 O'clock toast. Games, Specialty Grogs, Music and Dancing – Come shake your booty! Grub available noon to 8 PM. Shiver me Timbers – you will enjoy our ice-cold A/C."

#### As you can see, we will need pirates in the building daily, so come party like a pirate with us!

Watch for the magazine and please take a minute to read about the convention. There are many great classes and workshops you can attend, but you must go to Elks.org to register (\$50 in advance) and sign up for classes. And there will be one big party at your local Lodge, so put this on your calendar. It may be more fun to stay in Tampa this year than to head out of town!

The Convention is **BIG** – Rooms have been blocked at **16 different hotels** – all 10 of the big ones downtown, PLUS 6 that are closer to the airport! The Elks will have shuttles from the various hotels to the convention center. The hotels are assigned by state, and Florida has been assigned to Vinik's brand new Water Street J.W. Marriot. Though the convention runs from July 4<sup>th</sup> to the 7<sup>th</sup>, there are ritual competitions and tons of meetings in the days preceding and following. Elks can get reduced rates from June 28- July 8<sup>th</sup>. As an Elk, you can spend the night in downtown's newest hotel for under \$150 a night. **But you must book your room by June 4<sup>th</sup>!** Go to Floridaelks.org to register at the Elk rates. Just hurry down to your lodge after check-out to lend a hand.


The actual convention sessions are over by noon. There are some convention sessions that are reserved for Members of Grand Lodge-that means only Exalted Rulers, past and present can attend. They are the earliest morning sessions when voting on resolutions may occur. The classes take place in the afternoon, but they are optional. Afternoons are prime time for sightseeing so we will be opening at noon each day.


