Club Chivalry Report

At our Installation on March 27th Tampa 708 member Jose Ramon gave me a check for \$250.00 for Club Chivalry. What a pleasant surprise. It was deposited into the Lodge portion of our Club Chivalry account.

We had our third Club meeting of the year on March 29th. Our motto for the month is, "Success doesn't come to you - you've got to go to it!"

We were not able to secure a guest speaker that had been approved by the school board, but we did have a lot of announcements, mostly about the Senior cruise. We also played a game called "Candy Hands", which allowed me to pass out some Easter Candy without risking offending anyone. (It IS a public school). My volunteers were *Tommy Moore*, *Elma Kelly*, *Bonnie Atwood and Carolyn Miller*.

On April 3rd we had our end of the year event for the seniors. There are 18 seniors in the Club, and 13 were able to participate. The original plan was to go to an area chain restaurant, probably Olive Garden. Instead, Tampa 708 member Shannon Wheatley stepped up and offered us a ride through downtown Tampa on her company boat – The Tampa Bay Fun Boat! Then our school sponsor, Tampa 708 member *Carolyn Hand*, offered to buy our take-aboard lunch from funds she had as the Avid teacher. There was a lot of other activity on the River, which added to our enjoyment. We docked at about 12:15. Scholarship Report And....We have a Winner!

You may recall that the 2020-2021 Scholarship team consisting of *Rick Schneider*, *PER*, *Edie Hanley*, *Lynn Szeliga* and I graded 50 Most Valuable Student (MVS) Scholarships that were

submitted to the Elks through the Tampa Lodge. Out of the 50, we were only allowed to send the application of the top 3 male students, and the top 3 female students forward to the District. After which it was out of our hands. Now the results are in! Our top male student, Alejandro Quintero, earned a \$4000.00 scholarship payable at \$1000 a year if he retains eligibility.

Alejandro is an IB student from Robinson High School who lives in Port Tampa. Alejandro earned this scholarship with a 3.9 unweighted GPA on a "Most Rigorous" schedule! He was required to have 100 volunteer hours to graduate, but he logged in over 500 hours, mostly through St Patrick's Life Team and the YMCA Leader Club. He is also a Captain of the Mu Alpha Mathematics Honor Society, and a member of the Robinson Orchestra and Tri-M music Honor Society.

Alejandro has won National Level honors for Scholar College Board National Hispanic Program, AP Scholar with Distinction Award, AP Scholar Award, National Honor Society, and won State awards for Violin Duets.

His Math teacher and sponsor of Mu Alpha Theta for 4 years stated, "I hold Alejandro in the highest regard both personally and academically."





By 1900, Tampa had grown to a population of nearly 16,000, due mostly to the railroad, tourism, the cigar industry and the military. The leaders of the community, many of whom were to become members of the B.P.O.E., were positioned for growth and expansion. An organizational meeting was held in the Hampton Building at Franklin and Polk Streets, headed by Abe Maas, (of Maas Brothers) who shortly thereafter was elected as the first Exalted Ruler. On January 22, 1902, a delegation of 14 from Jacksonville conducted the initiation ceremonies that started that afternoon and lasted until the next morning. Tampa was one of 81 new lodges instituted by the B.P.O.E. in 1902. The Charter, dated August 14, 1902, was issued at the ensuing Grand Lodge Convention. By 1907, Tampa had become the largest Elks Lodge in Florida with a membership of 441.


