

# **Spotlight Grant Report**



## Christmas in August Stepping Stone Community Center

This year's Spotlight Grant was again able to be used for pandemic relief, so naturally we turned to Stepping Stone Community Center. This organization serves families in real need in one of the most economically depressed areas of Tampa. Under the lead of Christina Sanchez, we made a serious impact on 40 students and their families.

For starters, each child was given a pair of name brand shoes and some name brand socks, too. Since Christina is involved with this community center on a regular basis, and knows the children, she was able to get their shoe size and took notes about their preferences, making shopping an adventure. Along with her mom, Trustee Courtney Weil PER, she fought the Back-to-School traffic on Sunday, August 1<sup>st</sup> during the no tax week at Westshore Mall. Boy, did they come out with

incredible bargains! The pair then returned to the Lodge and with the help of a few members that just happened to be there, and gift wrapped and tagged all 40 pairs of shoes. Meanwhile, Leading Knight Rita Smith was tasked with purchasing 40 small toys or gifts with only \$200 to work with. A donation from Jack Johnson brought that part of the project in under budget.

Then, on August 4<sup>th</sup>, Courtney and her father, affectionately known at the Lodge as Whiz, did the major food shopping necessary to fulfill the third part of the project. two full meals for each family. The food was prepared the morning of the August 6<sup>th</sup> party, then everything was loaded and transported from the Lodge to the Community Center. We filled 5 large vehicles!

During the Christmas in August party from 4pm-6pm, a hot lasagna dinner was dished up for each family member. Additionally, each family was given a meatloaf dinner to take home and warm on another night. Also during the party, the students played a game in which they each won a bag of snacks, tried on their shoes and socks, chose their gift from the Santa workshop table, and picked out toiletries from the large assortment we provided. A couple of the older kids even composed a Christmas song. Tampa Elks helping at the party, besides Christina and Courtney, were Leading Knight, Rita Smith, Trustee, Shelagh Gombarcik PER, Lodge youth Activity Chair Patty Volpe, Whiz, and Jan Bertoch.









On August 1st Tampa Elks Lodge 708 held what is known as a VP Visit. The Dunedin-Clearwater Lodge Officers were co-hosts, so we scrapped our normal Pirate theme and went with Champa Bay to be more inclusive.

The room was set up and decorated in advance by Shelagh Gombarcik PER and Sue Moore, with some last minute help from Bonnie Atwood and Melissa Bertoch. The Florida State Elks Association(FSEA) Vice President for the West Central Florida District is Tom Moran, a PER from the New Port Richey Lodge. Tom is following last year's VP program of only having 4 VP visits instead of 8 as in years past. All District Lodge Officers are expected to attend all VP Visits, which is where information about the State President's program and the FSEA is disseminated.

Attendance was light, though we had expected 80-100 people, we had only about 70. The format remains mostly the same. It starts with a social hour as guests arrive. You are met at the door with an invitation to participate in various fund raisers, and to purchase the meal being offered for \$5.00.

Thank you to Sue Moore, Jackie Apple, Melissa Bertoch. Edie Hanley, and Shelagh Gombarcik, PER for working the door. Lodges bring their own appetizers, with the host Lodge providing for the head table. Because August 1<sup>st</sup> was National Watermelon Day, we had a slice of watermelon at every seat as the guests arrived.

The program starts with the introduction of the head table and dignitaries by one of the West Central District leaders, then finally the VP takes the microphone to introduce his program. This time he introduced our own PER and DDGER, Theresa Seibert. Theresa spoke about how the district had exemplified the President's motto. "Teamwork makes Elkdom Shine." She also outlined some of the FSEA charitable programs like scholarships and the beloved Beacon Grant Match. Following her speech, both Tampa and Dunedin's ER introduced their officers that were present, and then came the traditional roll call of Lodges. Each Lodge is called upon to announce how many officers, members and guests are in attendance. A few announcements are made, thank you gifts are offered to the wife of the VP by the LOE, and dinner is served.

In keeping with our theme, we offered served pulled pork or chicken sliders, coleslaw and Shannon's macaroni and cheese. Dessert was a chocolate chip brownie. Our Club Chivalry students did the serving, Jan Bertoch and Tommy Moore helped me in the kitchen, and a third of the 22 Elks in attendance stepped up to help plate the meal, which only took about 15 minutes. Following the meal, participants are free to leave which allows them to get back home before dark. Rumor has it the visit was a success, though it was not a fundraiser by any account.

On August 3<sup>rd</sup> Tampa Elks 708 had the assistance of two community partners, MGM Charity Partners and Happy's Home Furnishings, when they threw a back-to-school party for area children



in need. Over 20 volunteers arrived at 5:00 to unpack and set up the school supplies and food, and then to pack the bags with the appropriate supplies for each child based on their school and grade. 63 students came with a parent.

Upon arrival they each received a bag full of material from the Elk's Drug Awareness program, and a fruit snack. Promptly at 6:00 the spaghetti dinner was served to all the children, parents, and volunteers present. During dinner we had 4 different people take the microphone: Tampa Elks; PER Shelagh Gombarcik welcomed all to the Lodge and led the crowed in a prayer. Woogie Bajgier from MGM charity partners explained that the focus of their charity is children and Veterans, same as the Elks. Tampa Elks member Roshaun Gendrett, a professional motivational speaker, encouraged the children present to have their best school year ever by doing just 3 things: "Do your best," "Do the right thing," and "Don't give up." Next a gentleman from Happy's Home Centers spoke about their company's commitment to the families of South Tampa.

After the speakers had finished, and the dinner plates had been removed, each student obtained their personalized bag of school supplies and went to the MGM table to pick out a box of cereal, a box of pop tarts, and 10 snack items. They then went to the Happy's Home Furnishings table to pick up a drawstring backpack, tee shirt, and more supplies.

Tampa Elks youth activities chairmen Mike and Patty Volpe then led the children in playing three physically active games that could be played beside their seat. All the children took turns at the prize table, where they were able to choose additional school supplies, snacks, and even some small toys. By the party's end at 8:00, each child left with at least 3 very full bags of items to make going back to school more successful.

This past month, Georgia Hilficker along with the many dedicated Elks that give hours to the kitchen, and with the financial support from the LOE, and you, the membership, put together a plan to deep clean, paint, and renovate the kitchen.

Here's a list of just some of the work that has been completed:

- Painted/Repaired all drywall.
- Removed the chipped paint, and repainted the shelving.
- Removed wire racks at work table and installed new cabinetry.
- Cleaned the melamine walls around dish washing station.
- Cleaned ceiling fans and replaced damaged ceiling tiles.
- Cleaned, painted and repaired drawers.
- Pulled out gas appliances and clean floor and wall behind them.
- Cleaned and painted the area around handwashing sink and bucket station.
- Repaired wire rack by steam table.
- Repaired malfunctioning appliances; sanitizing machine, 2 gas ovens and large griddle.
- Installed a new electrical outlet at work table.
- Reorganized, cleaned and painted pantry
- Cleaned and reorganized freezers and walk-in cooler.
- Replaced some of the old cookware and utensils.
- Repositioning the chest freezer and installed refrigerator in pantry.
- Cleaned all appliances and washed all dishes, bakeware and serving equipment.


