MEET TAMPA'S OWN WWH VETS



Malen

Malen Griep was born on April 27,1926. He was one of 9 children living on a farm in rural Minnesota. In August of 1944, at the age of 18, Malen was drafted into the army and sent to Texas for training. That must have been quite an experience for a farm boy from Minnesota.

When he got to Europe he was assigned a motorcycle and was responsible for guarding German Prisoners of War. On his nineteenth birthday, Malen walked into a concentration camp and will never forget what he saw and experienced there. He hopes future generations will study and learn about the Holocaust and make sure it never happens again. He ended his time in the army on July 12, 1946.

Malen then went back to the farm in Minnesota to help his mother and siblings. Malen got married and they often spent summers in Kentucky with her family. They had four children: 3 sons and 1 daughter.

In 1982 Malen and his family moved to Ft Myers, Florida where they owned and operated a Dairy Queen for many years. Tragically, a fire occurred and the Dairy Queen was destroyed. Malen now lives in Tampa with his daughter Kathleen, and his wife Marjory is living nearby in an assisted living center.

Malen has only been an Elk for one year, however, he is a life time member of the American Legion. Along with Manny, Malen went on the Elks sponsored anniversary trip to Normandy, France. Malen enjoys bingo and board games and still drives himself wherever he wants to go.

Manny

Angel M. Maldonado, better known to us as Manny, was born in Ponce, Peurto Rico on April 29, 1927. Sadly both his parents died when he was still an infant, and his two sisters helped to raise him.

He moved to Connecticut at age 14 to stay with one of his sisters and her family. At the age of 17, Manny decided to enlist in the US Army. He trained to become a paratrooper in the 11th Airborne, and was stationed in Japan. He made 33 jumps during the war, often carrying part of a machine gun. After landing on the beach or in the jungle, he would have to find the other two paratroopers who carried the other part and the ammunition and put it together. It was only then that they had a weapon that would function.

After the war, Manny married, and fathered 2 daughters and one son. He now has 5 grandchildren living in Virginia. He also has spent a lot of time in New Hampshire where he has a summer home.

His parachuting adventures lasted well beyond the war and his last jump (out of a perfectly good airplane) was his 89th which he accomplished on his 91st birthday. He has lived in the Homes of Regency Cove for 30 years, and he remains active and fit by walking around the park everyday. At the age of 95, Manny is our youngest WWII veteran.

Manny has been an Elk for 26 years, and he appreciates the Elks sponsoring his trips to Washington DC, Pearl Harbor, and Normandy. These trips brought back many memories of his time in the service. Manny appreciates all that he has and feels that we still needs to support and fight for our country.

Tony

Anthony Marino, who we know as Tony, was born on September 4th, 1926 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Sadly his father passed away when he was 2 years old.

Tony's mother enrolled him in Gerard College, a boarding school for fatherless boys, where he attended school from 1st to 12th grade. His mother and two sisters would visit often, and Tony excelled in academics. He also enjoyed sports including bowling and baseball. He played second base and was a very good hitter. Tony has many fond memories of his time at Gerard College, and he made many lifelong friends including his best friend Rocky.

When Tony was 17, he wanted to join the Navy, but his mother would not sign his papers. Later he was drafted into the US Army and was sent to Texas and Arkansas for training. He was assigned to the 724th Light Maintenance Crew where he served as a staff sergeant in Japan and the Philippines as part of the American assault.

After the war, Tony came home and continued his education at La Salle, Temple, and Drexel Universities earning 3 different masters degrees. Tony had a long career in education where he taught and counseled many students. He also served as an educational leader for teachers, and at one point had 16 teachers to supervise at the same time.

When Tony retired, he visited family in the Tampa area and decided to move here. That was 33 years ago. He has lived in the Homes of Regency Cove for 31 years, and his niece Maria now lives across the street. His other niece Gloria visits often.

Tony has been an Elk for over 31 years and we used to see Tony nearly every day when he could often be found savoring a pint of Guinness. Unfortunately we don't see him as often because he does not drive anymore. Instead he has become quite an artist working on amazing patterned works in colored pencil.



The scholars have a busy schedule working Wednesday to Friday with Feeding Tampa Bay and Meals on Wheels, but they will be back in the Lodge on Friday night for dinner and fellowship.

1.Collect clean, usable clothing, and bring it in sorted by size, if possible, Tell your children, or adult grandchildren, that we need the outgrown but serviceable clothing. Hang on to those clothes until at least January 1st- then bring them to the lodge by 4PM on the 3rd.

2. Help us make the Gasparilla lunches. This will include a Cuban Sandwich making lesson. It's mostly sit-down work. That will start at noon on Tuesday Jan 3rd.

3. Help us sort clothing. The plan is to get everything sorted by sex and size, then delivered in 4 or 8 gallon bags with the sizes clearly marked on the outside so that the hurricane victims in need can just grab a bag and go. There are few large buildings in good condition on the island. The distribution will likely be outdoors.

4. Come to the Friday night fish fry on January 4th and meet these talented young people who one day may very well change the world.
