
ELK OF THE MONTH...PATTY VOLPE

Tampa Elks Scholarship News

Tampa received 44 scholarships this year. The scholarship committee was a panel of 5: Rick Schneider, PER, Roshawn Gendrett, Inner Guard Edie Hanley, Lynn Sziliga and Leading Knight Rita Smith. All judging is now done on line, with the

education and financial need automatically scored before we see them. We score based on Community service, extracurricular activities, employment, and other variables. This year it was a stellar effort in getting these 44 applications reviewed. We have all now completed the task, and the results are showing up on my dashboard. Males and Females compete separately.

Our top three males are Justus Irwin with a score of 908.05. He is the Robinson IB student and camp counselor from our Lodge. Jodi Alison's son. YAY! Maxwell Wensel is next with a score of 895.7. He is from Tamp Prep, and Joshua Smith-Salgada with a score of 868.55.

Our top females are Carly Joerin with a score of 896 from Freedom High, Annslee Maloy with a score of 876.7 from Hillsborough High, and Hope Tepfer with a score of 867. She is from Lennard High, which is in Wimauma and her application really should have been sent to South Hillsborough Lodge.

Now we wait and see.


These six applications will next go to District level judging, where they will be competing against the top scholars from all 8 lodges. Only the top three males and the top three females from those 48 applications get forwarded to the State level.

There are 500 scholarships awarded Nationally, and they are announced in the spring. Grand Lodge, under the leadership of Colleen Conrad, will notify those that advance and they will be required to provide more paperwork, such as income verification and a more current GPA.

We have concluded the Year 2021 Impact Grant. Our final Impact Grant event was a Christmas Party at Dave and Busters. 35 students were on board the bus, which meant their grades were UP and their permissions slip completed. We also had 4 Chaperones – Caroline Hand, our fellow Elk and sponsor, Tommy Moore, Trustee, Mike Volpe, Youth Activities

Co-chair, and me. The students had voted on a party instead of a present. The party was the day before final exams started, and they just needed and enjoyed the break from all that stress. In case you aren't familiar with Dave and Busters – it is similar to Chuck E Cheese, but for teens and adults. They have a package deal where each child gets a \$20 game play card. We arranged to arrive an hour before their normal opening, so the students had free range from 10-11 AM. We had a designated banquet room, beautifully decorated for Christmas.

At 11:30 we provided a lunch buffet which consisted of pizza, chicken nuggets, burger sliders, French fries, mac n cheese, and 3 types of sodas. Those were some happy kids! We also raffled off the game playing cards from a couple of the chaperones and the students who were absent.

At 12:50, we boarded the school bus for the return trip. We arrived back at school at about 1:30– which is the requirement when using a school bus and driver. And That's a Wrap!

New in 2022, we will be utilizing the Beacon Grant and their matching funds instead of the Impact Grant. We would be on our 7th Impact year, and each year the funding is decreased. The program will continue, but with different funding and a LOT less reporting! Another Change- Caroline Hand has informed us that she will be taking a leave of absence, starting in January, for health reasons. She has arranged for the Robinson High School PTA President to act as our sponsor in her absence.



Peteran's Committee Report


