# A Message from your Exalted Ruler, Rita Smith



This month I wanted to write about membership. But there is a more pressing topic.

While the three main elected officers of the lodge were at convention learning that we have no workman's comp for volunteers, should always hire licensed and insured professionals, etc, an employee in consultation with a few non-elected members took it upon themselves to renovate the bar without prior approval from the lodge membership.

This decision created liability issues, disrupted business, left the bar in shameful disarray for weeks during which we had a TV crew in to videotape our Florida Veteran's Historic Program, had a different TV crew in to videotape our "Open to the Public" Flag Day Ceremony, and hosted the wonderful West Central District PER association. As of this writing, it still is not completed, and it is unlikely to ever look professionally done.

There is a misconception about the extent that Tampa Elks Lodge is YOUR Lodge, It IS yours, you own 1/366<sup>th</sup> of the Lodge as of this writing. That small bit of legal ownership does not entitle you to act on behalf of the Lodge without the permission of the other 365 members. The permission is obtained through the BPOE Statutes, The Tampa Elks Bylaws, The Grand Lodge or Florida Elk Websites, or at a House committee, Board of Directors, or membership meeting. Of all of these, the membership meeting has the highest authority. There are two a month where you can make your case for whatever it is you want to do There is a very limited list of things that the membership cannot overrule. Most major events get scheduled by the House Committee at a Calendar meeting, but they can make exceptions.

No one member, or employee, can make decisions that affect the Lodge building, property or activities without permission of the proper above mentioned authority. It is certainly NOT "Better to ask forgiveness instead of permission. "Doing so violates your Oath and may possibly be "Conduct Unbecoming of an Elk." The Board of Directors is not "Where good ideas go to Die." Continued on pg 2

The Florida State Elk's Association held its annual convention at the Rosen Center on May 26-28, 2022. There are two separate parts of this convention – the reports, awards, and elections going on during the day, and the huge celebrations at night. It is mandatory for the Exalted Ruler and the Lodge Secretary to attend the business sessions of the Convention, and I can positively report that both Laura and I were in attendance throughout. Most of your Tampa Elk attendees were able to attend at least some of the sessions. Your ER, Treasurer and Secretary also attended a voluntary extra training session, and our youth activities group attended seminars on the Hoop and Soccer shoot contest. The Lodge received three awards- First Place in our division for our Lodge Bulletin, runner up in our division for the All-State award that is based on following the GL program, and third place in membership in our division. These awards were based on last year's program, so Paul Deland, PER, was on stage to accept them. 
