A Message from Your Exalted Ruler, Rita Smith

By the time you read this, it will be known that I was chosen by the State of Florida as the Veteran Volunteer of the



Year- Female division. I hesitated to accept, because I know am taking the credit for work performed by many in the Tampa Lodge, not just me. My honor is your honor. Tampa has always been good to the Veterans in our community and has been faithful to our commitment- "That as Long as there are Veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them."

When you have been an Elk for 27 years, as I have been, you are given a lot of opportunity to provide service for Veterans. My involvement started out slow — Can you help roll silverware for the upcoming picnic at the VAMC? One small job, then another. Before you know it, you are hopelessly hooked and now you are the one asking others to help with the Veterans and you are the one telling your grandkids that you can't make it to their birthday dinner because that's the night the Vets are coming.

And when ENF started up with Freedom grants and Welcome Home grants-Oh MY! That created meaningful projects for a whole lot of Elks to get involved with helping Veterans in Tampa. And combined with many other organizations, Tampa Elks did help!

In fact, the VAMC in Tampa stopped having standdowns a half dozen years ago because there was not enough need. Twelve years ago, Tampa Elks had an Impact grant to work with Athena House Veterans-Athena was a private/public transitional house for up to 14 females – last year it closed for a lack of clients. The James A Hailey's Tampa Domiciliary for homeless Veterans opened with 32 beds, they rarely have more than a dozen clients anymore. To the best of my knowledge, none of the Veterans to whom Tampa Elks provided Welcome Home kits lost their homes again. Elks can and do make a difference.

I saw my nomination letter. It was said I was selfless. I want to assure you that my nominator was mistaken. The truth is, I am not at all selfless.

In the brain, pleasure has a universal signature: the release of the neurotransmitter dopamine in a part of the brain called the **nucleus accumbens**. Dopamine release in this part of the brain is so consistently tied with pleasure that neuroscientists refer to the region as the pleasure center. 


Kentucky Derby Norse Race and Auction


