A Message from Your Exalted Ruler, Rita Smith



Team Tampa has been working to improve our lodge and our community. Everybody is a bit more comfortable in their new roles. Look for a lot of great things to happen in May- Mother's Day, my Birthday, a (first ever) Lodge Crawl, an evening with interactive comedy group The Improvaholics, then at the end of the month the party moves to Orlando so we can participate in the Florida State Convention. The House Committee has decided to close the Lodge during Convention this year- Thursday May 26-Saturday May 28th. We will reopen on Sunday, May 29th at 4PM. Oh, and did I mention my birthday? Let me tell you about my Birthday and my favorite 501C3 Charity- ENF!

The Elk's National Foundation (ENF) is a trust fund managed by a separate department at our National Headquarters in Chicago. The Director, Jim O'Kelly and his assistant, Debbie Doyle, have become personal friends and even visited our Lodge last year. Though charity guidelines allow for 30% overhead, these hard workers keep overhead to only 7%. The principal (Our donation) is never spent, but the interest the fund earns supports the third largest Scholarship Program in the country, the National Hoop Free Throw Shoot, The Drug Awareness Program, The Elk's Veteran's programs, The Major Charity for each State Association, the Elk's Veteran's Memorial, and the Community Investment Program.

Last year, Tampa Elks Lodge received over \$11,000 from this community investment program to support our charitable works right here in our community! We used the funds for The James A Haley Hospital lactation room and "Make a Difference Day"; sponsoring Club Chivalry, our club at Robinson High School; Christmas in August at Stepping Stone, where we provided new shoes, socks, and toiletries to 40 children in the Sulfer Springs neighborhood, as well as 2 full meals for their whole family; and for holding a water safety class including all the supplies for water safety to Camp Idlewild of Florida, a new camp for autistic children in Land o Lakes; and for the Humane Society of Tampa Bay adopt/spay/neuter event we held last month. Impressive! Yes?

Last year, for every dollar that was given to ENF from members in the State of Florida, \$1.93 was given back through the major programs. That doesn't include \$668,000.00 in community investments given to 86 lodges in Florida for local projects like the grants mentioned above. To participate in my Birthday Fundraiser just bring a check made out to ENF and put the membership number from your new purple Elks card on the memo line. **Don't be afraid** - on Friday the 13th - come to Your Lodge and let's party for a purpose.

Oh, and I would love to hear about YOUR favorite charity – especially if you do hands-on volunteer work.







We received 17 posters, and all the students drew their poster under the guidance of one teacher, though they were in 2 different grades. The title of the winning poster was, The BEST ME IS ARCHERY,

In lieu of participation certificates, Tampa Elks Tommy Moore decided to treat the students to ice cream. He carefully scheduled a date and time to present the students with the ice cream, only to be defeated by a rare spring thunderstorm. The following day, the kids were released from class to go outside and enjoy their hard earned treat.

In addition, Tampa Elks donated \$100 to the school which is to be applied to their Black History Month budget shortfall. On 3/23/22 Tampa Elks donated the remaining \$1225.00 left in their Beacon grant to Camp Idlewild of Florida, Inc. The Beacon Grant was divided between a water safety course at Camp Idlewild and a project at the local High School, and Robinson High School's Club Chivalry. Both projects came in well under budget. Camp Idlewild focuses on overnight camping for children with disabilities, particularly those on the Autism Spectrum. Open for only a year, they have a lot of projects that still need funding. The camp owner, Eileen Roach, indicated that this money will be used to start a major project on their wish list: building a teepee near the entrance to the property. 
