


ELK OF THE MONTH...JACQUIE LOCISERO, PLP, LP

Though I had over 180 eggs, they were filled within an hour thanks

to help from Lisa Mixon, Sharon Dobson, Betty Orcutt and Susie Harlow. Other volunteers planned to join in, but we were done before they finished their meal.

Bonnie and I showed up on meeting day a half hour early to deliver the eggs for the students to hide. We are limited to the auditorium on Club days, and to our surprise there was a class in the auditorium. That teacher's classroom was unusable, and she and her students had been moved to the auditorium. Luckily, there are enough defined areas in the auditorium that we were still able to pick a higher section of the room in which to hide the eggs. It took the four officers quite a while to hide the 180 eggs, most in plain sight. It took the students only about 10 minutes to find all 180 eggs. They used the leftover Just Say No bags from the Elks DAP program as their easter baskets for the hunt.





- October Hurricane Ian was disruptive, but we recovered enough to hold the annual DD visit and Book Inspection, and to have a Club Chivalry meeting and hand out the new T shirts to the students. The LOE had a fund raiser for Florida Elks Therapy services in conjunction with a Top Gun movie night.
- November The Lodge was a polling precinct for the National Elections. PER Gombarcik raised \$735 from the distribution of poppies and other solicitations and donated it to the American Legion Auxiliary Unit 139 where it will be used to help Veterans and Active Duty Military. Club Chivalry met and Theresa Seibert, PDD, was the guest speaker. We donated our \$2000 Spotlight grant to the TARP fund for Hurricane Ian relief to HPUMC. We spent two days and hundreds of dollars prepping and serving a Thanksgiving dinner to over 80 homeless men and women on the Sunday before Thanksgiving. During our Veteran's Day fundraiser for the Committee to help homeless Vets, we sponsored and honored our 3 WWII Veterans. We also donated 200 chickens to Gibsonton Elementary. We hosted a group of veterans from New Beginnings for a lamb dinner at the Lodge.
- December We sponsored Club Chivalry's Christmas Party with gifts, candy and a special guest speaker- Kristina Chowning. We hosted a mixed group of Veterans for breakfast at Pach's Place followed by participating the Wreaths Across America program at Post 5's Veteran Cemetery. We judged 35 ENF scholarships. Advancing 6. We gave out 90 McDonalds gift cards presented in Christmas cards to the homeless on Christmas morning. And we collected hundreds of toys from the Walmart Toy drive and had a fabulous Christmas party for some needy families in our area, as well as donating almost 200 gifts to Robles Elementary PTA for some of their needy families.
- January we began with a bang, collecting clothing for Hurricane Ian victims in SW Florida. We were aided in this drive by the PTA president from Robinson, who offered students community service hours to clean out their closets. Then we had 21 ENF Scholars come help us sort them and take them down to Pine Island Center. We again hosted the ENF Scholars for dinner on Friday night before they went home to their various universities around the country We had a Club Chivalry meeting and several Elks will appear in the Robinson HS Yearbook again this year! For the first time ever, we had some members and reality YouTube stars hold a meet and greet at the lodge.-with all proceeds going to our various Veterans' programs. We donated \$500 to the Academy of the Holy Names Rowing Club. We donated \$1000 to the Robles Park PTA for teacher's lounge improvements. Finally, we hosted 85 First Responders doing a bike ride to raise money for the families of Fallen Heroes throughout Florida.
- February is a short month, but we couldn't slack up. Club Chivalry had their big field trip to the Florida. Elks Youth Camp. We delivered over \$1000 worth of personal care and clothing items to New Beginnings, and we had a Pet Show in conjunction with the Humane Society of Tampa Bay. That pet show resulted in one adoption, plus a few hundred pounds of pet food and supplies, and some monetary and gift card donations. WE had our awards night, honoring all our greatest volunteers, and we had a very successful ENF fundraiser.
- March- We were again a polling precinct, this time for local elections. We handed out dictionaries to the third graders at Holy Trinity Lutheran School. We treated 21 veterans to a trip on the Tampa Bay Fun Boat, then followed that up with Brunch at an indoor/outdoor café. We sponsored an egg hunt at the Club Chivalry meeting. We made a \$250 donation to the Humane Society. We had 31 veterans from transitional facilities join us for our St Patrick's Day celebration. We helped to support the Autism Gala by purchasing a 1/4 pg add, 4 tickets, a raffle and heartbeat campaign. The LOE and the Lodge donated \$250 to South East Guide Dogs.
