#### ENF is good to you, and good for you! Can you be good to it?

ENF is the acronym for the Elks National Foundation. It is the Grand Lodge's Nation-Wide Trust Account that gives back to us much more than we give to it. This year, we will receive \$12,000 from ENF just in grant money to help our community. That money is used to feed the homeless, buy school supplies, T shirts and lots of snacks for Club Chivalry students, take Veterans experiencing homelessness to the zoo, buy gift cards so the homeless have a x-mas, reward teachers and students that show up to class in a low income neighborhood, and some is even donated to other organizations that do great work right here in Tampa. Every penny is spent in our community- not overseas, not in Harlem, *but right here in Tampa*, making lives better for some of our needier neighbors!

Other programs funded by ENF include the Drug Awareness Program, the Hoop Shoot, about 580 scholarships, and putting staff and money in every VA facility in the country. They also contributed over 600,000 to the State of Florida charities last year. They don't ask for much in return, considering all they give. 

### Florida Elks & Grand Lodge Still Have Scholarships Open for High School Seniors Until January 12

The Hope Scholarship is offered to Florida Students Only. This scholarship counts community service, school activities and citizenship as even more important than academics. In fact – you do not qualify if your unweighted GPA is over 3.59, but it does need to be at least 2.30. You must be an American citizen, and you must be a high school senior unless you are applying for law enforcement, fire, or corrections academy. There is no affiliation with the Elks required to earn a scholarship. Best of all – there is no restriction on the use of the scholarship other than you enroll in an American college or university, an accredited technical or vocational program, or a first responder's academy. Amounts range from \$3000 - \$30,000. The application opened August 1st and closes January 12th. You can find this application at C. Valentine Bates Memorial Hope Scholarships (floridaelks.org)

Through February 4<sup>th</sup>: Elks National Foundation still has a \$4000 scholarship open that is reserved for children and grandchildren of Elks. This is the Legacy Scholarship, and at least 15 will be awarded in the State of Florida. Last year we received 27 in this state. The sponsoring Elk must have been a member for 3 years but does not have to live in the same state as the scholar. Each state has a different quota depending on the number of Elks residing in the state. It is also a very competitive scholarship. These scholarship applications are graded on Academics, Charity, Community Service, and Integrity. Recipients will be required to serve the community with an Elks Lodge at least once a year. Apply at Legacy Awards (elks.org)

Unfortunately, the MVS scholarship has closed, and your Lodge scholarship committee is busy grading them. If eligible, students should apply for both the MVS and the Legacy scholarships.

### Tampa 708 - Talking Turkey With Open Arms



For about 8 years now, Tampa Elks Lodge has used the Beacon grant to provide a special holiday meal for the homeless at open Arms Ministry, a division of Hyde Park United Methodist Church. Originally, Courtney Weil took charge of the Kitchen at the Church, and we fed 200 to 300 men, women, and children the Sunday before Thanksgiving. That population dwindled greatly during Covid, as some were moved across the county into shelters and others

did not survive. This year, we were told to expect about 120 guests. I don't think the total hit 100, but it was close.

All of the food was prepared at your Elks Lodge, The shopping was started over a week in advance, and the cooking starting on Thursday, when the 55 pounds of boneless breasts were cooked. On Saturday at noon, Douglas Grant, Steve Kraft, Jeremy Elkins, Ruth Levin and Norm Jones showed up to help prep the dishes. We had everything but the gravy oven ready and in the walk=in by the time we left about 4. Then on Sunday, at 7 AM, Doug Grant and I were back in the kitchen making gravy and running everything through the oven. Baking times varied, but at exactly 10:30 we had the cars loaded and headed to the church. Upon our arrival at the church, we were greeted by Tampa Elks Kim Van Walker and Michael Volpe. Our friend Susan Brandise and a dozen girls from her rowing team from the Academy of the Holy Names showed up to help us again this year. Elks Patty Volpe, Richelle Nickle, young Jacob, Sue Dawson, Joe Dawson and Amy Morantes rounded out the Elk's Crew.

Each of the guests was treated to Roasted Turkey Breast, Dressing, Mashed Potatoes, Gravy, Green Bean Casserole, Candied Yams, Corn, Cranberry Sauce, a Roll with Butter and a slice of Pumpkin Pie with Whipped Cream. It was much more food than they are to used to getting at one meal, and the line for seconds, when offered, was very short. Fruit was also offered to the guests, it is purchased weekly by a parishioner who is a pediatrician. The coolers were loaded back into the cars, the Elk aprons gathered up, a leftover pie snagged, and we were back at the lodge about 12:30 – And I was home fast asleep before 2!

I love working with Open Arms Ministry. Their motto is " Making God's Love Real." Or, as told to me when we first started, . "We don't preach God's Love, we show it." Yes, they do! Rita Smith, PER






