A Message from your Exalted Ruler, Rita Smith



February is an EXCITING Month for the Elks, as this is when we learn who our new Officers will be for the 2023-

2024 Lodge Year. There will be nominations for Officers at the February 8th meeting. If there is more than one candidate for any office – that position's election is held at our meeting on February 22nd. By February 23rd, the transition period begins. The incoming Exalted Ruler, Treasurer, Secretary and somebody on the House Committee will go to mandatory training in Orlando from Friday March 10th through Sunday March 12th. Don't bother taking your swimsuit – its all work and no play.

Every member is eligible for every vacancy. The Elks prescribe tor a 4-year training program starting as Lecturing Knight and moving through the Loyal and Leading Knight chairs to Exalted Ruler, but that is not always the case, and perhaps no longer even the norm.

Both the 4-year and the 5-year Trustee position will be available. Like the name implies – if elected, you would be a Trustee and sit on the Board of Directors for 4 or 5 years. The Secretary and Treasurer jobs are up for election, too. The persons holding these positions must be bonded, so there is a little – very little – bit of salary. These positions are usually best filled by more experienced Elks, but there is no specific requirement for either job. Both require heavy money handling and computer skills, including excel.

Please come to these meetings and take part in selecting the best available officers for the long-term future of our Lodge. Maybe the best available is you!

On February 17th we will have our Membership and Awards Night. Come enjoy a free meal and see who stood out from the crowd this year. Please sign up in advance so we prepare enough food. This night is happening unusually early this year- For that, I'm blaming Hurricane Ian for setting off a string of changes in our calendar.

As for me, on April First I will move into the status of "PER": Past Exalted Ruler. It is a title with no authority within the lodge whatsoever unless I become a part of our PER association. I can be called upon to sit in for an absent officer, or to participate in future Installations of Officers. Maybe I will occasionally be asked to give the 11 O'clock toast. And lucky me -I get to wear an orange jacket if I go to a National Convention – always held in July. Hmm - I might need one this year, since the convention is in Minneapolis!

The year was 1972, Helen Reddy's anthem for a new generation of young women "I Am Woman" was released. Maxie dresses, hot pants, and tube tops were all the rage. Leaving many parents wide eyed at their teenage girl's fashion choices. We gathered around the tv to watch in

amazement as Mark Spitz won a record seven gold medals in swimming at the Munich Olympics. We cheered the Miami Dolphins as they played a historic undefeated season. My grandmother's beloved Cincinnati Reds lost to the Oakland A's in the world series. But most importantly, at least to some of us, the musical group Abba was formed. And

somewhere on Bayshore Blvd. overlooking Tampa Bay a group of ladies came together to form what is now known as the Ladies of the Elks.

Little did these ladies know that 50 years later, what they started would still be thriving. Over the years our membership has fluctuated, sometimes growing in numbers, sometimes, not so much. But no matter our size, always having an impact on our lodge, our community, and our charities. Our ladies have spent countless hours volunteering. We've cooked, we've cleaned, we've decorated, one of us has organized the lodge's closets so many times she probably has nightmares about them. We have pulled up our sleeves and helped in any capacity necessary to get the job done. Over the past 50 years, our ladies' impact has been inspiring. Our hard work has benefited our lodge, we purchased kitchen equipment, revamped the ladies and men's bathrooms, helped to purchase a much needed shed, make a monthly donation to our lodge's Friends of 708 and so much more. We are proud to say that over the years we have continued our unwavering support for Childrens Therapy Services. Our Ladies have donate thousands of dollars over the years to CTS. In just the last few years, our ladies have been recognized by FLOE as having the highest per capita donations for a ladies' organizations. Did our Ladies stop there? I don't think so. Our community is equally important to the Ladies. Through the years we made dinners for parents at Ronald McDonald House, donated to the American Legion's poppy fund, and supported Southeastern Guide Dogs (an organization that trains guide dogs for disabled vets). This has been our joy and our mission.

Our history is rich and colorful. We are proud to say we opened our Ladies organization to men. Leading to our iconic (in our opinion) saying, for \$15 we can make you a Lady. We were honored to have had a FLOE state president Betty Pickenpaugh. She pushed to allow lady auxiliary members who were Elks, voting rights in FLOE. Some of our Ladies moved on to a higher calling, many becoming ERs of our lodge, Tracy Horrell (our first LP to become ER), Shelagh Gombarcik, Theresa Seibert, and now Rita Smith. One PLP has climbed heights that in 1972 were never imagined. Moving from LP to ER to Vice President of the West Central District and then District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler.

The positions Theresa Seibert has held was not attainable in 1972, in fact she, or any of the Ladies, would not be welcomed to become Elks until 1995. Mother-daughter LPs, we have them. Barbara Huffman and AnnaMarie Bishop, Carolyn Miller and Barbara Miller and Susie Harlow and Theresa Siebert. Multi-generational membership is still thriving today, Crystal Johnson, our current secretary, is a 4 th generation Elk and a 3 rd generation LOE member. Her grandmother Elenore Dayes served two terms as ladies president. Although I never had the pleasure of meeting Elenore, her daughter Edie Hanley shared that Elenore was fantastic cook and enjoyed sharing her love of cooking with the lodge.

Looking back on our 50 years, I think about the ladies and men who have proceeded me, and the memories sprinkled throughout our lodge. Helen Beeler, our first ladies' president. Did she know what was started so long ago would continue to grow, supporting our lodge and charities? Or that a group that was conceived because we wanted to contribute to our community and lodge and were not welcomed to become Elks, would allow men into our fold, in a shorter timeframe than we were allowed to become Elks. This led to our most colorful, ladies' president, our beloved and unforgettable, Bill Edwards. His time as our Ladies president raised more than a few eyebrows across the state. Then there's Carrie Short who made and donated to the lodge a beautifully crocheted American flag.

After more than 30 years we still look to her flag when we recite the pledge of allegiance. Rita Smith and Shelagh Gombarcik, who wanted to commemorate and congratulate our LOE's only FLOE state president Betty Pickenpaugh. They hosted what may have been FLOE's first hospitality room. Knowing Rita and Shelagh, I'm sure their hospitality room gave new meaning to the phrase partying with a purpose. These are but a few of our Ladies that have impacted our lodge in a memorable way. On a personal note, when I was encouraged by Sue Moore to run for LOE president, I was unsure if I was up to the task. Sometimes I still feel that way. But I hink back over my years as LP I am in awe of all that we have accomplished. In that time, we have raised and donated over \$11,000 to CTS, spruced up our breezeway, donated yearly to ENF and many other accomplishments I know I have forgotten. The Elks Scholars Came and Conquered!

On Sunday January 1 st through Tuesday January 3rd, Tampa Elks collected gently used clothing from Lodge members, members of the community, and to my surprise from members of the local high school where we sponsor Club Chivalry for Successful Students. One Elk brought in 8-9 bins of clothing from their storage unit! There was a lot of Elk participation. The PTA President at Robinson HS offered community service hours for teens that cleaned out their closets That combination resulted in a very large collection. Tuesday morning, we had our Iconic Tampa Cuban Sandwich assembly line composed of Georgia Hilficker, Sharon and Joe Dobson, Betty and Trustee Bob Orcutt, Bob Orcutt and Jan Bertoch preparing 50 brown bag lunches for the scholars to take with them on Wednesday. By Tuesday evening, when we were fortunate enough to have 16 Elk Scholars from all over the country come into Tampa Lodge to help us sort clothing, there was a mountain of bags, bins and boxes, and our walk in refrigerator was full of coolers of sandwiches and drinks. A few scholars suffered flight delays and didn't make it to the Lodge that night.

Thank you to House Committee George Hilficker and Chaplain Susie Harlow for helping to transport the students back and forth from their hotel. The Robinson PTA president, Ami Granger, Elk members Jan Bertoch, Bonnie Atwood, Lodge Trustee Doug Grant, Sharon and Joe Dobson, Tiler Richard Florence, Leading Knight Camden Lynn, Shelagh Gombarcik PER, Elk Scholar Fellow Raleigh Cury and even Past State President Frank Palladini all joined in the fun of folding and sorting that mountain of clothing. Debbie Doyle, Assistant Director of Elks National Foundation and Meaghan Morris, Senior Associate for Lodge Grants, stopped by for a visit. The 4 th ENF staff member, Mckenna Cannon , Manager of Youth Programs, remained at the hotel to greet the scholars with flight delays. My worries about having too many clothes were unfounded, as the job was completed in about 3 hours.

The students ate some pizza, wings and salad and said goodnight. But all 20 scholars, and 4 staff members were back the next morning at 6:45- this time with a large travel bus. They quickly loaded the hundreds of bags of clothing into the luggage compartment of the bus, grabbed the coolers of drinks and sandwiches, and were on their way to Pine Island Center to deliver the clothing and do more community service for victims of Hurricane Ian. Although I did not accompany them, I was told that a Baptist church in Bokeelia was waiting for the clothing, The church had tables set up and a free clothing sign outside by the time the students arrived. After setting up the clothing distribution, the students were divided into two groups, with one group working on removing the storm damaged furniture and fixtures from an elderly person's home, while the other group did similar work at what is left of the Pine Island Elks Lodge. Before rejoining us for dinner on Friday Night, the scholars also served at Metropolitan Ministries, which runs a huge outreach program for the homeless and needy, and at Feeding Tampa Bay. I was very impressed with the Elk Scholar Service Trip Program. While other organizations give a student a scholarship and say "Goodbye" or "Good luck", the Elks give out a scholarship and say, "Hello".





Lodge Business and Projects

The new floor is in, and what an impact it makes on the Lodge Room. With the new paint, new floating bar and the reappropriated storage spaces, it has gone from drab to fab. It wasn't easy, and I have a whole lot of Elks to thank For making this happen. Bonnie Atwood and our new Chaplain Susie Harlow brought in lots of bids for the floor – several different types of floors. Ceramic tile, luxury vinyl tile, carpet squares, carpet and luxury vinyl planks

were all considered by our Board of Directors. Once the vinyl plank was chosen, the next challenge was to find a spot on the calendar. When the saleslady told us it would take 6 days, it looked impossible. But there was one opportunity – if we could get moving fast enough.!

We voted for the floor at the meeting on December 28th and agreed to installation starting on January 12th. That was certainly an "All Hands on Deck" decision. The back hall and all the closets were loaded to the max with items being stored. The whole room needed to be painted, all the outlet covers replaced, the old wet bar needed to be disassembled and that plumbing system needed to be capped. But we were still in holiday mode- decorations were up, parties were planned. The work started on January 3rd.

Member Dee Wilson sent her friend Mike Devos to our rescue, and I called on our Veteran friend we met through the domiciliary – Mike Sexton. We had two professional painters, and the hall was painted in just 3 days. Trustee Bob Orcutt handled the plumbing, Nelson Grahn took a saw to the old bar. A Pod storage rental was crucial to our success, and along with the shed. Under the direction of Susie Harlow it was filled with the help of Leading Knight Camden Lynn, Patty Volpe, Betty Orcutt, Sharon and Joe Dobson, Trustees Doug Grant, Tommy Moore and Bob Orcutt, Whiz, and House Committee Chair George Hilficker. When the shed and POD were filled, we utilized the Antler Room. PER Shelagh Gombarcik had dibs on using the back Ladies' bathroom for LOE storage, and Trustee Wendy Hall and PER's Paul Deland and Dee Cisneros utilized the men's room to store stuff from the liquor room. We had a Lodge meeting on January 11th, after which the attendees – Officers and others- helped with the alters and remaining chairs and tables being moved into the bathrooms, too. We were ready.

The installers had to be let into the building and supervised each day. 
