

On Sunday, July 23rd, Elks Rita Smith, PLP, Patty Volpe, Lisa Davitt, Mike Volpe and Lisa's son, Brian, who was here on vacation, and our friend from ALA unit 139 volunteered at the Open Arms Ministry. We have partnered with this

ministry of Hyde Park United Methodist Church for about 10 years. It has been a good, two-way partnership. That is where we met Steve Kraft, out dishwasher and Rich Allen, a musician who had performed a half dozen times at the lodge. There have been some changes since we first started, but this ministry has evolved into something much easier for the volunteers. For example - instead of reporting no later than 8AM on a Sunday morning, they now ask us to come at 10:30. Instead of 18 people dishing food onto trays for 2 hours or more as the line of hungry needy people seemed to never end, they now have the customers come in, get their beverage, and take a seat. Then 4-5 volunteers take trays of food, baskets of fruit, and carts of sweets around to serve them. It was heart warming to see the men and women come in , take a seat, be served, relax, and chat with each other and with the volunteers. We were finished and out the door by 12:30, but those "Feel Good" endorphins lasted all day!

They are in need of volunteers, especially as the summer vacations continue. The new schedule is harder for their church members, as it over-laps Sunday Services. If you would like to give it a try, contact me and I will send you the link to sign up. I can accompany you there any Sunday in August except the 13th, which is our VP Visit. You can bring your children over 8 years old, your neighbors, or your friends.

Grant Reports

Is there a High School Senior in your life?

The Elks offer four very different scholarship opportunities.

All four are now open!

MVS is the big one – with 500 total scholarships awarded nationwide in amounts ranging from \$4000 - \$30.000. The application period is from August 1^{st} to November 13^{th} . There is no



affiliation with the Elks required to earn a scholarship. Students are judged on Academics, Leadership, Financial Need and Community Service. The scholarships are awarded to the best and the brightest kids around. This scholarship is called the Most Valuable Student Scholarship, or MVS for short. Applications are done online at enf.elks.org/MVS and submitted to the Lodge closest to their home address. Use the Lodge locator box on the home page of Elks.org to see which is the closest lodge. The top 20 scholars will be required to spend a weekend with the Elks in April to receive the full \$30,000.

The Hope Scholarship is offered to Florida Students Only. This scholarship counts community service, school activities and citizenship as even more important than academics. In fact – you do not qualify if your unweighted GPA is over 3.59, but it does need to be at least 2.30. You must be an American citizen, and you must be a high school senior unless you are applying for law enforcement, fire or corrections academy. There is no affiliation with the Elks required to earn a scholarship. Best of all – there is no restriction on the use of the scholarship other than you enroll in an American college or university, an accredited technical or vocational program, or a first responder's academy. Amounts range from \$3000 - \$30,000. The application opened August 1st and closes January 12th. You can find this application at FLORIDAELKS.ORG/HOPE-SCHOLARSHIP.

The 3rd scholarship that opens September 1 is specifically for the children and grandchildren of Elks. This is the Legacy Scholarship, and at least 15 will be awarded in the State of Florida. The sponsoring Elk must have been a member for 3 years but does not have to live in the same state as the scholar. Each state has a different quota depending on the number of Elks residing in the state. It is also a very competitive scholarship. These scholarship applications are graded on Academics, Charity, Community Service, and Integrity. The scholarship award is \$4000. Recipients will be required to serve the community with an Elks Lodge at least once a year. Apply at enf.elks.org/leg

There is one more scholarship for which you hope to never have to apply. That is the Emergency Educational Grant. This grant is offered to unmarried children under 24 years old of deceased or totally disabled Elks. The grant is renewable and up to \$5000 per year. Applicants must attend a US college or university full time as an undergraduate and demonstrate financial need. To apply – contact the ENF Scholarship office at scholarship@elks.org.




