Each year the Florida State Association's Historical Program sends our veteran members to Washington D.C. to be part of the Parade of Heros, an annual event held on Memorial Day. This year we sent our distinguished member, Sam Washington. Here's what he had to say about his experience.

When I got back from the 3 day trip to D.C., a lot of people at the Elks were asking me "How did you like it?" At the time, it was hard to explain. Now, I have had the time to think about it, I now know why it was called, "Parade of Heros", Because every stop we made, was a "parade", and we were the only "float".

People cheered along the way; we were escorted by "Honor Guards' at every stop. The honor guard consisted of law enforcement personnel; some were JR ROTC, and there was a lot of cheering by passengers at the airports. We sang patriotic songs as we were being escorted. I don't know if the singing was planned, but it was

Grant Reports

Club Chivalry Report

On November 13th and December 11th, we had Club Chivalry Meetings. We have a large Club this year, and they are all in either the 11th or 9th grade. This was done on purpose, as the Asst Principle of Administration, Ms. Morman, hand selected the students. Because of the 2-year gap in their ages, we spent the November meeting on more team building. We did various exercises using 24 piece puzzles that are sold for children 5 and up. By the December Meeting, we were ready to have a guest speaker talk about his career. We served them pizza as a Christmas treat and a "sit down and shut up" incentive. Senior Master Sargent Sam Washington, retired, did a good job of holding the student's attention while he talked about his career in the Air Force. The Selective Service system was discussed, and the fact that Sam Washington had been headed for a professional basketball career but was worried about being drafted into the Army. After hearing about the benefits of a 20year career, he signed up for the Air Force. By the time he retired, he had three daughters and had a home in south Tampa. Following his retirement, Sam served another whole career as a Police Officer, mainly working at the airport. The students were remarkably attentive, asked some good questions, and overall, it was a good and informative meeting.

Important Information



MOST VALUABLE STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS JUDGING

The first level of the scholarship judging has been competed here at Tampa Elks Lodge #708. We received 27 applications this year, way down from the 50 we had 2 years ago. When looking for reasons for that huge drop, it's

hard not to blame the pandemic. This year's seniors started their high school career in the fall of 2019. Schools shut down in the spring of 2020. Those kids did not have a normal high school experience, and they may never fully recover from that. The drop was not for lack of advertising or awareness that the grant was available. Those 27 we did receive were from all over the Tampa Bay Area.

Rick Schneider, PER, Lynn Szeliga, and I served as Tampa 708's judges. It took just over two weeks for all judges to get each of the 27 entries reviewed and graded. The composite score from the three judges becomes the final grade.

We will be sending the applications from the top 3 males and the top 3 females to the District Judges for their decision. At district level they will have 48 scholarships to judge -6. from each of the 8 lodges in the Wonderful West Central District.

In the male division our first choice is Benjamin Avriett, who attends Plant H.S and plans to study performing arts. Second is Chase Hartman, from Sickles H.S., and Third is Logan Virgil, an IB student from Robinson H. S.

In the female division Susmita Gudia from King H. S. took first place. She plans a career in Health Care. Second was Ishitha Panguluri, from Freedom H.S. and in third place is Kaylienne Brandis, who lives in Tampa now but is finishing her senior year at Dunedin H. S. We wish all these amazing high school students the best of luck as their applications proceeds through the process!



Dear Members of Tampa Elks Lodge #708:

Your Lodge Board of Directors is turning to our membership as we face a major sewer problem not anticipated in our budget.

The main sewer line from the rear of the building to the road behind the Lodge is both untenable in its current condition, and needs to be addressed immediately to prevent further Lodge damage. Repairs have been an ongoing problem for several years. Frequent and recent calls to repair our blocked Lodge sewer line have led to a video showing breaks and broken sections of the existing line.

Totals for replacing the line exceed \$14,000.00 as a minimum with several bids received.

We must look to our members for help in the form of donations to a sewer fund being established as a restricted account.

Any donations, from a small amount to sizeable offerings will be appreciated. We are especially asking those capable of doing so to provide donations which will have a positive impact on our needs.

We will recognize those donors who wish it...and likewise...maintain anonymity if requested. Please forward such donations by check or debit/credit card to the office, or mail them to the Lodge address:
