EXALTED RULER ADDRESS

To all of our Veterans, Happy Veterans Day!

Veterans Day began as a day to honor the end of World War I, marking what was known as the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918. Congressional Legislation was passed in 1938, dedicating the day to the cause of world peace that was known as Armistice Day, which honored only veterans who fought in The Great War. In 1954, at the urging of veteran's organizations seeking to honor those who fought in both World War II and the Korean War, the 83rd Congress amended the original legislation by removing "Armistice" and replacing it with "Veterans."

In 1968, the Uniform Holiday Bill provided a three-day weekend for federal workers, by celebrating Veterans Day, Washington's Birthday, Columbus Day, and Memorial Day on Monday, with Veterans Day scheduled for the final Monday in October. However, there was significant opposition by many states to celebrating Veterans Day in October, prompting those states to adopt the original November date.

Finally, on September 20, 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed a bill restoring the annual observance of Veterans Day to November 11th beginning in 1978. If the 11th falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday is designated as a federal holiday.

Just in case you forgot, Tampa Lodge #708 is honoring veterans in our own way this year. On November 5th, we will host our first **Military Appreciation Ball!** We will have a fine filet mignon dinner and outstanding entertainment by the 13-piece **Brass Heart Band**. You should bring your dancing shoes, because these guys are known as "The Hottest Horns in the Heart of Florida!" They specialize in the sounds and rhythms of the 60s through the 90s in the tradition of Tower of Power, Chicago, and Blood, Sweat and Tears. It promises to be an outstanding evening. Tickets are \$25.00 and are available at the bar. Proceeds will go to fund our Lodge Veterans programs. 


