

Tampa Lodge # 708 House Rules

- 1. The House Committee will at their discretion designate the hours and days of the Club or Lounge operation. The Lounge will be closed during all Lodge Meetings and special ceremonies. The hours of operation will be posted.
- 2. I.D. Cards issued by the Secretary shall be honored in the Lounge.
- 3. Any member in debt to the Lodge will not be permitted to participate in Lodge activities, or use of Lodge facilities.
- 4. Member-guests shall be signed in and non-member guests shall be signed in by a member in good standing, who must remain in the Lodge with the guest.
- 5. Non-member guests will be held accountable to the same standards as members. Members will be held accountable for the actions of their non-member guests.
- 6. Tampa Lodge #708 is a Non-Smoking Lodge.
- 7. Dress Requirements: Elk members and guests are expected to wear attire that is neat and clean. Examples of unacceptable attire include being barefoot, wearing dirty, torn or ragged clothing, attire that is sexually revealing or clothing with obscene or vulgar wording or pictures. The Exalted Ruler or appropriate function/event chairperson may specify the proper dress code for special events.
- 8. No minors are permitted to be seated at the bar.
- 9. No confidential Lodge business shall be discussed at the bar.
- 10. Loud, boisterous or obscene language, or conduct unbecoming an Elk, is strictly prohibited and will not be tolerated. Violations are subject to House Committee action, up to and including suspension of Lodge privileges.
- 11. No alcoholic beverage of any kind for consumption or unsealed shall be brought into or taken out of the Lodge.
- 12. No animals are allowed in the Lodge except for those trained to assist disabled persons or for the purpose of a special demonstration.
- 13. No one is allowed behind the bar, unless in the performance of his or her duties.
- 14. Checks in excess of \$50.00 above the purchase shall be approved by a member of the House Committee or the Lodge Secretary. A member issuing a worthless check will have his or her check cashing privilege suspended until the debt has been satisfied including payment of a worthless check fee as provided for by law.
- 15. It will be at the discretion of the Bartender and/or a House Committee member to stop serving alcohol to anyone who they feel has consumed enough alcohol to impair their judgment.
- 16. The Lounge will always be subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Business Professional Regulations, Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco.
- 17. Complaints, comments or suggestions concerning the operation of the home club operations, shall be in writing addressed to the House Committee.
- 18. Whenever the House Rules are changed or amended and approved by the Grand Lodge, a copy of the new House Rules will be published in the next available Elksize and distributed to the general membership. Thereafter, a copy will be provided to all new members at the time of their initiation along with copies of the Constitution and Bylaws. A current copy of the House Rules will be displayed on the main Bulletin Board at all times.
- 19. The responsibility for the compliance of these House Rules belongs to all members.

Bylaw Revision Committee Report Rita Smith, Bylaw Chairperson

I am pleased to report that we have received notice from the Grand Lodge Judiciary Committee that the Bylaw Changes voted on in October have been approved, with one placement change on where to put new language. It will take several months before we have the new printed copies. The House Rules, which were also approved as submitted, are being printed in this Elksize in their entirety, but I will summarize the Bylaw changes.

Life membership rights can be purchased for 25 times the annual dues; Life members pay \$10.00 to Tampa Lodge 708 plus State and Grand Lodge assessments.

There will not be a second meeting in the months of May and November. Alternative forms of the rituals, as approved by Grand Lodge, may be used at the discretion of the presiding officer.

The Treasurer's salary is now \$75.00 a week.

All bills, except recurring bills from "utilities companies or food and beverage dis-

tributors" must be voted on by the membership prior to payment being made.

The House Committee now has only seven members, instead of thirteen.

Dues increased to an amount totaling \$93.25 when state and National Assessments are added to the \$75.00 for the Tampa Lodge.

The LOE's name was corrected to read: Ladies of the Elks Auxiliary Tampa No. 708.

Last, but not least – Our unique Partners in Progress Fund, and the procedures for withdrawing funds, are now outlined in the Bylaws.

I again want to thank the Bylaw committee, Chris Miles, Pat Boyd, Richard Florence, Cynthia Green and Tracy Horrell, for their many hours of work to make this General Revision a success.

The Florida Elks Youth Camp, Inc., a not-for-profit corporation, is dedicated to enriching the lives of children from the state of Florida. The camp staff presents a safe camp experience that contributes to each camper's mental, physical, and social growth.

The Florida Elks Youth Camp (FEYC), a project of the Florida State Elks Association, is located on 405 acres of rolling hills, forests, lakes, and open space in Marion County, Florida. The Florida Elks are proud that our camp is accredited by the American Camping Association and is recertified every three years to assure compliance and a safe camping environment for children. The camp has a ratio of one counselor and one counselor in training to every seven campers.

The camp opened its doors in 1991 to all of the children of Florida and has played a pivotal role in the development of so many children. It offers them countless opportunities that have not previously been available to them. Their team-building skills are improved, they have access to state of the art recreational equipment, and they have a chance to enjoy themselves in a caring, social setting where the good of the children is always the priority.

Who uses the camp? We offer summer camp opportunities to any Florida child as well as Elks' children and grandchildren at a modest cost for one or two weeks. However, we don't turn away those unable to pay. Additionally, the camp is used year-round by a wide variety of organizations dedicated to enriching the lives of children in general and underprivileged and disabled children in particular.

The camp has become one of the finest of its kind in the country. It is already a facility that Florida Elks take pride in, and it is a popular place for Florida's young people, as thousands use it every year. We hope that, at some point, you are able to visit the youth camp when visiting in the area."
