
As always, please RSVP to the Lodge Secretary by Wednesday prior.



Follow the statutes to a successful Lodge

This is a simple reminder that when we were initiated as Elks we each took a solemn oath called the Obligation. We all took the same oath as there is no short form of the Obligation. At the beginning of this oath, in fact the second paragraph, we each swore to “support the Constitution, and obey the Statutes, rules and regulations of this Order...” As long as you “obey the Statutes” you are in a safe harbor, free from discipline or chastisement. Additionally, every serving Officer doubled up by solemnly promising at his installation to office to “conform with and maintain the Constitution, Statutes, rules and regulations of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America ...”

Lodges have a large degree of independence and sovereignty but each and every Lodge must adhere to a basic structure and rules that are specified in the Statutes. Our Statutes are not laid down as tablets of stone but are adjusted every year by the delegates to the Grand Lodge Sessions. Thus, the Statutes are adjusted to the evolution of our society and culture.

Every Member has the opportunity to initiate a change to the Statutes. The procedure for changing them must be strictly adhered to and also must receive the approval of a majority of the delegates at a Grand Lodge Session.

Truthfulness and adherence to our self-made laws is represented by the principle station of each Local Lodge – the station of the Exalted Ruler. In fact one of the few express statutory duties is to “enforce the Laws of the Order.”

Enjoy Columbus Day this month and have a safe and Happy Halloween.



The doors open at 7:30, and the homeless are lined up. Most agencies that feed the hungry are not open on Sunday, so the need is real.



On the Holidays, Tampa Elks Lodge helps make even more of a difference by providing a special meal and distributing new socks, t-shirts and underwear to these less fortunate citizens. Once a month, the homeless have an opportunity to “shop” the used clothing that has been donated. We regularly collect blankets, clothes and shoes for this project. We also collect reusable plastic containers so they may take any leftover food with them for a second, hard to come by, meal.

Tampa Elks Lodge is thrilled to be the recipient of a third ENF Beacon Grant to help fund this project. 
Elk of the Month: Wendy Hall



AMERICANISM REPORT

Authentic History & Origin of BPO Elks - The Eleven O' Clock Toast

The information stated here as paraphrased by me was written by Charles Edward Ellis in 1910 as a BPO Elks Historian. Charles A.S. Vivian, was the son of an English Clergyman came to America as a 22 year old entertainer & formed a group of Actors & others called the "Jolly Corks". When a fellow Actor died unexpectedly before Christmas, leaving a wife & family destitute, the Jolly Corks decided to Turn their Jolly Group into a more purposeful Fellowship - so the Jolly Corks became the Benevolent & Protective Order of Elks. George F. McDonald, who was one of the Original Jolly Corks, described as a man who had considerable Literary Skill felt that the breaking up of Elks sessions at 11pm on Sundays was too casual. Normally, after inquiring about the missing brothers, donations were taken for the poor, & attendees finished their evening without a formal Ceremony of Leave-taking. On May 31, 1868, McDonald proposed a Toast at Eleven O' Clock: "TO OUR ABSENT BROTHERS". THE TOAST, and the feeling behind it, thus almost from the first became an Elk Landmark. This Landmark - Tradition developed by time, going back to Vivian & McDonald evolved into the Elks Ritual & ELKS USA Statutes - Article I -The Supreme Law Section 1 - Opinion 6. Today the "The Eleven O' Clock Toast" is formalized in Lodge's using "It is the hour of Recollection" - then the entire recitation of the Toast as described in Opinion 6. Note that Opinion 8 - Sentence One -"It is NOT permitted to use a substitute for the Eleven O' Clock Toast in the ritual or any official ceremony prescribed by the Grand Lodge". This sentence thus secures the sanctity, sovereignty, & absolute ownership of " The Eleven O' Clock Toast" for both Elks Ritual - AND - for everyday use for all American Elks to remember "Our Absent Members."

The Elks registration table at the Florida Hotel will be staffed during the convention from 2:00 to 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday and from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Thursday & Friday.


