







Elk of the Month: Rick Smith



AMERICANISM REPORT



As the Lodge's Americanism Committee Chairman & the West Central District Americanism Chair I will from time to time remind our Members, Families, & Guests of certain aspects of being a good & faithful Elk that is a responsibility for all to get to know & understand.

My First Reference source is the ELKS USA STATUTES ANNOTATED 2013 EDITION & is a word-for- word reference: Chapter I, Sec. 1, Page 1 --ARTICLE I-- THE SUPREME LAW Section 1. This Constitution, the Statutes enacted by the Grand Lodge not in conflict therewith, and the Ritual, shall be the Supreme Law of the Order.

OPINIONS (There are 09 in this Article I)

Opinion 06 The Eleven O'clock Toast may properly be given by one other than an Exalted Ruler or Past Exalted Ruler. The only requirement is that it be "done in a dignified manner." Opinion 08 It is not permitted to use a substitute for the Eleven O'clock Toast in the Ritual or any official ceremony prescribed by the Grand Lodge. There is no prohibition against use of other versions at informal or social gatherings, as long as the version is proper for the occasion. Please take note that there is much flexibility given to Lodge Officers, PER's, & others who visit the many "informal or social gatherings" - especially as to methods used - "as long as the version is proper for the occasion." These two(2) Opinions are the whole basis for & reasons why there are so many different "Eleven O'clock Toasts" in the here & now within Elkdom!

Formal "Protocols", Rules or Written Regulations do NOT exist. There are specific historical Traditions & their wordings that are specific to the origins & their attachments to originators of Elks & the B.P.O.E. that are used in Rituals as stated in Opinion 08. The Origins of & the Factual History of "The Eleven O'clock Toast" will come next month!
