Tampa 708 Makes a Splash at the Women Veterans Recognition Breakfast



Edie Hanley, Representative for James A. Haley Hospital was asked to be a guest speaker at this event. She spoke about the formation of the Elks and all of the charitable works that we do. She told them that our motto is no veteran is left behind. Additionally, the challenges of women to be members of the Elks. The audience was surprised to hear that it did not occur until September 1995.

At least 3 audience veterans considered joining the Elks after she finished the speech. Crystal Johnson, Deputy Representative has also noticed that many individuals are not aware of the services that the Elks provide through the National Headquarters monthly stipend for the veterans at James Haley Hospital.



DINNER FOR OUR VETERANS

On July 12th the Lodge Veteran's Committee at Tampa Elks 708 hosted 9 Veterans from New Beginnings of Tampa for a Prime rib dinner, complete with stuffed mushrooms appetizer and a peach cobbler dessert. New Beginnings is a rehabilitation center currently housing 57 transitional Veterans. It is expected that about 30% will likely return to the workforce. The rest will retire or be declared disabled. The goal is for all of them to transition to permanent housing. Many Veterans arrive at New Beginnings with nothing but

the clothes on their backs. They accept donations of new or gently used men's clothing.

Richard Florance, PER, set the table up for the night and Richard Schneider, PER, hung our banner. Our volunteer servers were Elks Scholarship recipient Morgan McDaniel, Veterans

Chairman Chris Ragusa, and Lodge Veteran Committee members Dory Lannigan and Evelyn Hemmingway.

The money to pay for the meal came from fundraising by the committee, and generous donations from Elks.

The Veteran's Committee is looking for more members. They meet the second Monday each month, so the next meeting is August 13 at 6:30. As you can see, the work is not arduous, but it is meaningful. Consider this your invitation to join.


enthusiasm for everything that we do that I care about.


difference, doesn't make a difference!" The Texas Elks Camp is their state major project.



Hugh C. MacFarlane (Elk)

Hugh MacFarlane was born the 28th of December 1851 in Scotland. His hometown was Pollok Shaws Renefewshire. At the age of 14 he immigrated to the United States with his parents and eventually ended up in St. Paul, Minnesota where he attended St Johns College. After graduation he went to Law School at Boston University. After successfully completing the bar, he opened up a Law office. He married his first wife who was only known as "Miss Brown". They had a son James. Soon after that they were divorced and Hugh then moved to New Orleans. He decided to move to Tampa after hearing wonderful stories about the town in

1884. He married Francis Pettingrill. He quickly blended into the local political scene and joined

several attorneys to organize the Tampa Board of Trade. He was known as the Old Guard of the Board. He was also involved in many philanthropic and social organizations including the **BPOE**. He was a City Attorney for 3 years and then was appointed States Attorney in 1890. He was a big advocate of West Tampa and built a park on a large plot of land off MacDill Ave. He passed away on the 7th of January 1935.


