

A GENEROUS MEMBER BUYS DINNER FOR OUR VETS

In an extremely generous gesture, Tampa Elk Shirley Menedez purchased 15 tickets to the Low Country Boil that the Ladies of the Elks put on July 19th. The tickets were given to the Lodge Veterans Committee so they could invite 15 of the transitioning Veterans in temporary housing at the Salvation Army. The Salvation Army has partnered with the Veterans Administration and recently built a separate facility for veterans experiencing homelessness, and they have 50 beds dedicated to Veterans.

They have also purchased a 15 person van so now they can include more of their clients in our excursions. The inclusion of female Veterans is also recent, and three females came to the Low Country Boil. It was a very delicious meal, consisting of crawfish, shrimp, clams, sausage, potatoes, corn and a roll to sop up the juices. Dessert was a lemon crunch cake.

It was also a very successful merge of the Elks, the Ladies of the Elks, and Salvation Army. The Ladies of the Elks did the cooking, members of the Lodge Veterans Committee worked as servers, and the committee picked up the drinks tab.

Remarkably, the Salvation Army's 15 Veterans had included one of their staff members from another city who was so impressed he made a generous donation to the Veterans Committee.




