LODGE VETERANS COMMITTEE REPORT

Elks National Foundation Spotlight Grant – Project Adopt-A-Haven: The Tampa Elks 708 Lodge Veterans Committee applied for and received approval for a Project Adopt-A-Haven grant under the Elks National Foundation Spotlight program.

Project Adopt-A Haven grants are used to work with emergency shelters or transitional housing facilities specifically for veterans. Tampa Elks 708 will receive \$2000 to support quality of life initiatives at Liberty Manor For Veterans, a housing and social service resource



provider for homeless veterans in the Tampa Bay area since 2006. Tampa Elks 708 has been working with Liberty Manor for over a decade by hosting on-site dinners and planning and executing off-site activities for their veterans.

Partnering with Liberty Manor on this grant will positively impact its 16 unhoused veterans by offsetting the transportation cost of getting their veterans to interviews, VA appointments and shopping trips, and provide them with two unique evenings of food and entertainment for their veterans. Lodge Veterans Committee members Jose Remon and Chris Ragusa met with Liberty Manor's founder and CEO Connie Lindsay on January 18th to coordinate how this ENF grant can best be used to improve the lives of the veterans who are sheltered at her facility.

They have been identified by the school social worker for membership to the club based on low school attendance and/or high occurrence of in-school or out of school suspension. The mission of the club is to promote attendance and positive behaviors.

During our meeting the students appointed Club President, Vice President, and Secretary distributed the new "backed by Tampa 708" Motivated Mustang Polo shirts to each student upon their arrival. Carolyn Miller gave each student an attendance ticket and as each student put on their new shirts, she gave them a 2nd ticket. We explained that if you come to our club meetings with your club shirts on, that you will get 2 attendance tickets. Ms. Hunziker, the school social worker, challenged the students to







wear their polo shirts every Tuesday and check in with her to earn another attendance ticket. The attendance tickets are gathered and I is chosen. The winning student gets a \$25 Walmart gift card.

We played a team building game called "Keep the balloops up." The students were split into 3 teams, and

If the balloon fell or the student stepped out of the square their team lost. Last team with balloons in the air won. Game 1 had no planning. Game 2 the students came up with a plan. Game 3 the students asked Elks for ideas on how to win. It was a lot of fun watching the students working together on a plan and then executing that plan. It was even sweeter when they took the advice of our Elk volunteers.

We then did a round of weekly wins, where we ask about winning moments the students may have had since our last meeting. There were lots of wins this time and we look forward to more next month. As part of our commitment to serving the students of the Motivated Mustang Club, we were able to supply 3 of the students with new jackets and backpacks. These items were identified with keeping the student's home from school during the cold weather.


