

# FLAG DAY CEREMONY AT 708



Elks and Flag Day: The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks has a long tradition of patriotism and respect for the American flag. In 1907, the Grand Lodge of the Elks passed a resolution to designate June 14th as Flag Day. This was a



significant step in promoting national recognition of the holiday. In 1911, the Elks made it a mandatory requirement for all local

lodges to observe Flag Day with appropriate ceremonies. This solidified our commitment to the observance of the day. The Elks' dedication to Flag Day observance played a role in gaining national recognition for the holiday, leading to President Woodrow Wilson acknowledging our patriotic efforts. Finally, in 1949, President Harry Truman, who was an Elk himself, signed an act of Congress designating June 14th as Flag Day nationwide.



On Saturday, June 14, 2025, the officers of Tampa Elks 708 conducted the Flag Day ritual with the help of Cub Scout Pack 1381 (chartered to American Legion Post 138) and Scouts BSA Troop 219 (chartered to Interbay Moose Lodge 912). In what was the most well attended Flag Day ceremony in recent history, approximately 85 members, guests, and sheltered veterans from Liberty Manor for Veterans and Salvation Army's Red Shield Center participated in the event.

Your Lodge Veterans

Committee used the Flag Day celebration to raise funds to support our mission of providing onsite and offsite activities for local sheltered veterans and Tampa Elks 708 members who have honorably served or are currently serving in the US Military. Committee members prepared and served a BBQ meal consisting of smoked baby back spare ribs, cowboy beans, corn on the cob, coleslaw and Texas toast. The Ladies of the Elks donated a sundae bar for dessert, which was a big hit.



### Lodge Business and Projects



### Let me tell you about the Elks National Foundation - ENF

This charity helps Elks help the communities where they live. .

They offer over 500 Most Valuable Scholarships a year, ranging from \$4,000 to \$30,000. Applications for these scholarships come first to the lodge for scoring, then to the district, state and finally professionals in Chicago. 33 students from Florida received scholarships. They also awarded 12 Legacy scholarships to children or grandchildren of Elks, and emergency scholarships to children of recently deceased Elks.

ENF offers Lodges the opportunity to apply for grants to do charitable projects in their community. Tampa's 2024-2025 projects included a trip on the river and lunch at Ricks for 25 Veterans from 3 shelters, the Motivated Mustang program at Madison Middle school, an accessible bathroom at Liberty Manor for Veterans and transportation help and 2 dinner and movie nights for Liberty Manor's Resident Veterans. That was \$11,500 in cash from ENF to Tampa Lodge to help us meet some local needs.

A total of \$750,500 in grant money came to Florida Lodges.

ENF also Is the main supporter of the Veterans Affairs Veteran Service. The VAVS staffs volunteers in each VA hospital in the country. At James A Haley VAMC, two of the 3 VAVS volunteers are from Tampa Lodge: Edie Hanley and Crystal Johnson. They get monthly funds for VA needs. When you donate to ENF – you can designate how you want it spent!

ENF does all this with minimal staffing, and their administrative costs are under 9 %.
