Grant Reports and Information

Lodge Veterans Committee Report

The Tampa Elks 708 Lodge Veterans Committee (LVC) began utilizing the Elks National Foundation (ENF) Spotlight Adopt a Haven grant that we received. The \$2000 grant will allow us to provide \$1000 in prepaid fuel cards to support transportation for the Liberty Manor for Veterans residents, and we catered a Dinner and a Movie night at Liberty Manor on January 26 for their 16 sheltered veterans. Your LVC will be preparing and hosting another Dinner and a Movie night for the Liberty Manor vets at the 708 lodge on Saturday, March 1.

The LVC also applied for and received an Elks National Foundation (ENF) Gratitude Grant for \$3,500. We'll use this to fund the installation of an ADA compliant roll-in shower at Liberty Manor for Veterans. We will partner with Home Depot and their volunteer associate workforce Team Depot to accomplish this project. Dates for the demolition of the current bathtub and installation of the prefabricated shower have yet to be determined. Pictured are the current step up and over tub shower and the new wheelchair accessible shower stall. Four veterans utilize the bathroom that we are remodeling.

Your LVC hosted veterans from the Salvation Army's Red Shield Center for Courtney's Chicken Fried Steak on Friday, February 21 and veterans from the New Beginnings shelter for a BBQ rib dinner on Friday, February 28. At our January 13 meeting, the Lodge Veterans Committee voted to commit \$1500 to sponsor a veteran's participation in the 2025 Florida Elks Parade of Heros trip to Washington, DC from November 8 – 12. Eligible Elk veterans can fill out an application to attend on the Florida Elks website.

Fundraising events will be held on Saturday, April 19 (smoked ribs and pork, prepared and picked up from our parking lot for Easter dinner) and on Monday, May 26 when we will prepare and serve dinner at the lodge for Memorial Day.

We've moved our meetings to the 4th Monday of the month, and our next meeting will be on Monday, March 24. Prospective committee members are welcome to join us at 6:30pm in the banquet hall.
