



# ENF SCHOLARSHIPS NOW OPEN

Applications for Elks National Foundation Scholarships are Now Open. Scholarships are one of the programs that you can direct your ENF donation to support.

Support systems can be hard to gain, especially ones that understand the challenges of transitioning to college. With scholarships from the Elks National Foundation, students receive more than financial aid; they receive an invitation to join a strong, supportive community: the #ElksFamily.

Ranging from \$1,000 to \$7,500 per year, Most Valuable Student scholarships are open to high school seniors who will be pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis, in a United States college or university. Five hundred four-year scholarships will be awarded to the highest-rated applicants in the 2026 competition.

No relation to the Elks is needed to apply for the MVS scholarship, but once someone is an Elks scholar, they are part of the #ElksFamily for life.

#### ENF will award at least 30 MVS scholarships to youth in Florida

For Legacy Awards winners, the Elks have always been part of the family. Awarded to children or grandchildren of Elks, this \$1,000-per-year scholarship requires recipients to serve with an Elks Lodge three times over the four years they receive the scholarship.

#### ENF will award at least 10 Legacy scholarships to youth in Florida

As they enter the next stages of their life, the class of 2026 Elks scholars will feel a wide range of emotions; with their new #ElksFamily, they will never feel alone.

Applications for the 2026 Most Valuable Student scholarship and Legacy Awards are now open! If you know any high school seniors, encourage them to apply.

YOU can sponsor a scholarship with the pledge to donate \$4000.00 over 4 years, payable either

monthly through the Fidelity Club or all at once. As the sponsor, you can name the scholarship, list criteria such as major, school, or state, and you will be matched with a scholar and receive updates on their progress.

There are other scholarships such as the Emergency scholarship and the Weeigle scholarship for students who have already begun their higher education.

In 2025-26, the Elks National Foundation will award \$5 million in college scholarships, ensuring a bright future for our nation's youth. As important members of the Elks family, Elks scholars receive many social and service opportunities with the Elks and one another. # Tampa 708 DRUG AWARENESS PROGRAM

The Tampa Elks Drug Awareness Program -DAP --has a new chai, and Rosann Garcia is off to an amazing start! First, on Sunday June 29<sup>th</sup>, she worked with Patty Volpe to inventory the DAP Supplies in the youth activities closet. An ENF Legacy award Scholar, Lucas Dye, a University of Tampa Student, assisted with the heavy lifting.



Next, she provided Drug Awareness Program supplies to the 69 children attending the Tampa Elks Lodge's. Back to School party that was held on July 27<sup>th</sup>. Each child received a DAP bag filled with school supplies and a red ribbon.

Finally, Rosann agreed to participate in the Back to School Block party being put on by GainesHope, Inc. A 501C based out of the University of Florida. That was the organization that received our leftover school supplies. The Elks were invited to set up a separate station at their Hope on the Block event in West Tampa, a section of town that has a high poverty rate. Rosann Garcia and Patty Volpe showed up at the block party with a shade tent, folding table, a couple of chairs, some color me tablecloths, jars of crayons, and a lot of prepared DAP bags, Though Roseann acknowledged it was a smokin' hot day, they spent 4 hours ensuring Drug Awareness Material & good will reached over 100 children & adults in the West Tampa community. 




